EVERGLADES HOMES TOUR

One of the buildings on our **Everglades Homes Tour** on **Saturday, March 9**, from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. is this little shotgun house, so called because you could shoot a gun from the front door through the back door. This design helped to keep the inside cool as the breezes also went through in the days before air conditioning.

It is thought that the collection of identical shotgun houses at the north end of Everglades City was built in the 1920s during the construction of the Tamiami Trail for workers.

Other buildings on the tour include City Hall (the original Collier County Courthouse) which will be opened specially on that Saturday so that out-of-town visitors can see the beautifully-restored interior.

You will be able to buy the souvenir ticket booklet for the Everglades Homes Tour at \$20 at **Art-in-the-Glades** which takes place on the same day in McLeod Park from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. An order form is on our website for advanced bookings. For info, call (239) 695-2905.
