Saturday, January 27, was a momentous day in the history of Everglades City Hall when distinguished guests and several hundred local people watched Mayor Sammy Hamilton cut the ribbon that symbolized the re-opening of the building after extensive renovations. With him in the photo above are (left to right) Congressman Mario Diaz-Balart, City Clerk Dottie Joiner, County Commissioner Jim Coletta, Mayor, John Bruce (contractor) and Bob Burkhard from FEMA.

Mayor thanked FEMA, the State, the County, and ESHP. Without their help, City Hall would have crumbled into the ground and we would have been faced with a modern building that could never have the historical importance and aesthetic appeal of our original Collier County Courthouse. He also praised John Bruce who spent so much time making sure the restoration, from the foundations up, went smoothly.

After the opening ceremony, the public was invited inside and all remarked at how beautiful it looks now, especially the old pine floors.
