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

REPORT FROM THE BOARD

MSD CELEBRATED

The 6TH Annual Festival honoring pioneer conservationist Marjory Stoneman Douglas is being held at the Museum of the Everglades on **February 23-26**. There are numerous events focusing on the Everglades and the surrounding wilderness areas.




Marjory wrote the hugely-influential book *Everglades; River of Grass* which was published a month before President Harry S Truman officially opened Everglades National Park at a ceremony in Everglades City on December 6, 1947. She became known as “the mother of the Everglades” for her public talks stressing the importance of the natural flow of water from Lake Okeechobee to Florida Bay and she founded Friends of the Everglades in 1968 (at age 78) to stop the massive jetport in the Big Cypress. She died aged 108 in 1998 having seen dramatic changes in Florida including the building of the Tamiami Trail (US-41).

ESHP president Marya Repko will speak on **Thursday, February 25**, at 2:00 p.m. about the Fakahatchee, part of the Big Cypress watershed that feeds the Glades. She will also be signing copies of her book *A Brief History of the Fakahatchee* which has chapters about early settlers, logging the giant cypress trees, the Gulf American “land scam”, and the fight to save this unique ecological treasure. If you missed her illustrated lecture in November, here’s another chance to learn about the “Home of the Ghost Orchid”.
