Early Everglades Photography

Dr. Jerald Milanich spoke on March 20 about Julian and A.W. Dimock who traveled around southwest Florida from 1904 to 1913, taking photos and writing articles. Thousands of glass plate negatives were donated by Julian to the American Museum of Natural History (AMNH) where Dr. Milanich found them.

During his presentation we saw pictures of this area, some of which were immediately recognizable (eg, the Storter Store which is now the Rod & Gun). Others were more obscure and a discussion about their identity continues via email.

The book *Enchantments; Julian Dimock’s Photographs of Southwest Florida*, which Dr. Milanich and Nina Rich of the AMNH produced, has numerous photos with captions. It is available at \$35 from ESHP. For info, call 695-2905 or download an order form from our website.
