We were sorry to hear that **Dorothy ("Mama Dot") Weeks** passed away recently in her 93rd year. She was known for the delicious hamburgers she served at her café in the Everglades Inn and for getting up early to make breakfast for the crabbers.

Dot and her late sister Margie grew up in New York where they met the Weeks brothers who were posted there during World War II. They married after the war ended and the four of them moved to Florida.

Dot recalled living on a houseboat near Everglades City while her husband fished. When he died leaving her with young children to support, she was asked by the Collier interests to open a snack bar in the Inn.
