## Everglades National Park 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary



ENP was opened in 1947 by President Truman at a ceremony in Everglades City. Congress had authorized the park in 1934 after Ernest Coe and others lobbied to save the Glades but World War II intervened. Land was accumulated in the interim, much from the Collier interests. Miles Collier, son of Barron, was instrumental in having the official opening here.

A re-dedication is being held by the Park Service on Thursday, December 6, in City Hall. The program during the evening is:

- 5:00 - Refreshments
- 6:00 - Welcome and Reading of Truman's speech
- 6:30 - "I Was There When ..." stories about 1947 from local people (everyone welcome to join in!)
- 7:30 - Films "Everglades!" from a 1960s TV series

## HISTORIC DESIGNATIONS EXPLAINED

This is a summary of an article in *The Mullet Rapper* (10/26/07) by Patty Huff which explained what Historic Designations are all about. Within the City, a building can be declared "historic" in a proclamation passed by the City Council. Outside the City, the County Historical & Archeological Preservation Board (HAPB) can give a structure or place an historical designation. At federal level, it can be listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The current owner must agree first.

The advantage to being listed is that a building does not have to be brought up to "code" (raised up on stilts) and there may also be tax breaks for restoring an historic building. However, any major changes have to first be approved by the County HAPB, as well as Planning & Zoning, and the building can not be demolished. For more info, phone Patty at 695-2397.



## COPELAND CHURCH THREATENED

The old Bula Mission Church in Copeland, at the 5-way junction, has been condemned by the County. ESHP has been working with the executor to stop immediate demolition and to have the building listed with the County as historic. It is thought that the grounds contain the graves of babies.

The Church was given to Ms Frances Hodge as the oldest living member of the congregation after it was dissolved. She wanted the building to be used for the community and offered it as a Post Office when the old Janes' store were torn down. Ms Frances died in August this year just before her 101<sup>st</sup> birthday.

ESHP is evaluating what can be done with the structure. A survey will be made by a contractor to determine if it can be salvaged. If you know anything about the history of the building, please contact Patty at 695-2397.



## HISTORICAL LIBRARY

Many people remember the Inn with the hardware store and Mama Dot's which burnt down in 1987 but we have also lost the "movie theater" (Club Everglades), community center (Seminole Lodge on Riverside), the old jail (where Susie's Station is now), and many other establishments along West Broadway (near the tennis courts).
