

BRICKS INSTALLED

The commemorative bricks that were ordered during the past year have been delivered and were finally installed in front of Everglades City Hall at the end of September.

A new campaign will begin in the new year.



DEACONESS HONORED

Deaconess Harriet Bedell, who lived in Everglades City from 1933 to 1960 at the Glade Cross Mission, was added to the List of Lesser Feasts & Fasts by the Episcopal Church during their Convention in July.

The Deaconess helped the local Seminole Indians to market their crafts and visited their camps to teach them good hygiene and to nurse them with her medical skills.

Before coming to Florida, she had worked as a missionary in Oklahoma with the Cheyenne and in a remote village in Alaska.

Her life is described in a new book "*Angel of the Swamp*" which is available from outlets around the area or from www.ecity-publishing.com.

The Deaconess' feast day is on January 8, the anniversary of her death at age 94 in 1969, and there will be a talk about her at the Museum of the Everglades on that day in 2010.

New Booklet

The Collier County Historical & Archeological Preservation Board is preparing a new edition of their little pamphlet about historic sites and buildings in the county. ESHP are helping in the production with our knowledge of this area and with design.

SWAMP BUGGY HISTORY

The tradition of Swamp Buggy Races goes back to 1949 when a group of Naples residents decided to put on a show for visiting outdoor writers. The races and parade grew into a tri-annual festival. One of the highlights is throwing the Queen into the mud but the races are predominant and the high-powered machines are sophisticated, almost floating in the water that has replaced ordinary muck.

A new book celebrating 60 years of this unique event has been compiled by Lila Zuck, a colleague of the late historian Maria Stone who did so much to preserve our history in interviews. Lila has graciously donated a copy of *Naples' Oldest Tradition, Swamp Buggy Days* to our Historical Library.


News from the Historical Library
