MONROE STATION RESTORATION

Monroe Station was one of six similar facilities along the new Tamiami Trail across the Everglades completed in 1928.

They provided rest stops in those days before the road was paved and sold snacks as well as gas. The Southwest Florida Mounted Patrol cruised up and down the Trail from the stations to help motorists who were stranded.

In later times, Monroe Station was a popular meeting place for travelers and hunters in this remote, isolated area.

The property is now owned by Big Cypress National Preserve in Ochopee. The building was added in 2000 to the National Register of Historic Places because of its importance to Southwest Florida. The intention is to restore it to its original profile with historical exhibits downstairs and offices above.

ESHP has offered to help with fundraising and grant applications.
