


FAKAHATCHEE HISTORY

A new book was launched at our standing-room-only illustrated lecture on November 20 about the History of the Fakahatchee. The packed audience heard Franklin Adams and Marya Repko talk about the island, the logging in Lee Cypress, and the fight to save the area from the developers of Remuda Ranch Grants.

Franklin recalled first-hand experiences from his teenage days hunting in the “Fak” with his father and brother to his association with Mel Finn, the Miami attorney who pushed both state and Federal legislatures to create a park out of the ecologically-unique land. In fact, the old logging trams have recently been recommended for the National Register of Historic Places.

FILM-LAND IN THE GLADES

Hollywood glamour came to Southwest Florida when Gypsy Rose Lee, Burl Ives, Peter Falk, and a youthful Christopher Plummer filmed “Wind Across the Everglades” in 1957. They all bunked down in the Everglades City Rod & Gun Club while shooting on location in the swamps and town.

Movie-making is not new to Florida. It goes back to the early 1900s when emerging cities tried to attract producers with the lure of a perfect climate and real scenery.

Between then and now, crews have invaded for “Distant Drums”, “Gone Fishing”, “Just Cause”, and “Adaptation”. Even Woody Woodpecker got in the act for “Everglade Raid”.

You can learn more and share your memories at a Nostalgia Night illustrated lecture on **Friday, January 8**, at 5:30 p.m. in historic Everglades City Hall. The guest speaker is Rob Davis, Director of the DeSantis Center for Motion Picture Industry Studies at Florida Atlantic University. He assures us that he has dug up some interesting information and has unusual images in his presentation.
