

New Book

Marya Repko has published her latest little history book, *Women in the Everglades; A Brief History of Pioneers and Early Environmentalists.* She has extended her area of interest to include the east coast (Miami, Ft. Lauderdale) and the area around Lake Okeechobee.



After describing the hardships of early life in these isolated areas, she tells how women took a lead in establishing Royal Palm state park (precursor to Everglades National Park) and in trying to stop plume hunting. Another section describes how they helped the Seminoles.
