On election day, we will be open from 7 AM - 8 PM to accept ballots!

This month, voters of San Diego County's District 4 will have the chance to elect a new supervisor- weighing in on who should represent them in county government. Whoever, they elect will play a key role in shaping county policy on public health, housing, homelessness, transportation, climate, and more.



Under the supervision of the Program Manager, the primary goal of the Youth Transition Coordinator is assisting persons with disabilities aged 14–24 to reach consumer-driven goals related to enhancing, improving or maintaining their independence through the provision of programs offered at the CIL and connecting youth to community services. The Youth Transition Coordinator facilitates educational workshops aimed at improving, reducing, or eliminating societal stigmas about disability with the purpose of empowering consumers and cultivating a new generation of life-long advocates. The Youth Transition Coordinator must have vast knowledge of college-related resources, vocational programs available locally and youth-related services offered locally and nationally. The Youth Transition Coordinator performs various duties in support of Access to Independence mission and may also have unique duties and responsibilities associated with a particular grant.

Qualifications:

- High School graduate and lived experience, preferred, or;
- Associate's or Bachelor's degree in a related field with a combination of lived experience
- Peer-to-peer experience
- Bilingual, American Sign Language certified; preferred but not required
