TRANSITION & DIVERSION PROGRAMS

Transition Program:

Supports individuals to safely transition from residential medical institutions into their own independent homes by providing equipment, supplies, and case management services.

Diversion Program:

Supports individuals who are high risk of becoming homeless or institutionalized to stay in their independent home by providing equipment, supplies, and case management services.

SUCCESS STORIES HAWAII OFFICE

Ms. Allison, a 30-year-old woman, was referred to Access to Independence by the REHAB Hospital of the Pacific due to a spinal cord injury that left her physically disabled. As her home was not designed for wheelchair access, she relied on a wheelchair to enter and exit, facing significant challenges and risks without proper accommodation. Financial constraints and lack of insurance coverage for an access ramp compounded the problem.

Access to Independence, collaborating with her parents and the REHAB staff, successfully coordinated and constructed a ramp for Ms. Allison, ensuring her safe entry and exit from her home. Ms. Allison and her parents are deeply grateful for the hard work, dedication, and time invested in this project, which has significantly improved her health and safety.

SPRING ENERGY-SAVING TIPS FOR BUSINESSES
