

# Ahead of the 2022 General Election on Nov 8, we have a few key reminders for Hawaii voters

- 1. <u>Hawaii is a vote-by-mail state.</u> As a registered voter, your General Election ballot will conveniently arrive in your mailbox. Gone are the days of carving out time to vote at your assigned polling place. Hawaii voters are automatically mailed a ballot for every election.
- 2. Check that your voter registration is current. Visit elections.hawaii.gov or call (808)453-VOTE (8683) to verify that your voter registration is accurate. By law, ballots cannot be forwarded through the mail, so if you have moved or changed your mailing address,

- <u>3. Vote your ballot.</u> You can expect to receive your ballot by October 21 for the General Election. Read the instructions, mark your ballot with a blue or black pen, seal it in your return envelope, and sign the envelope.
- <u>4. Sign your ballot return envelope.</u> The return envelope must be signed for the ballot to be counted. The signature on your return envelope is compared to the signature on your voter registration record. If the signature matches, your ballot is accepted and recorded to ensure only one ballot is counted for you.
- <u>5. Ballot must be received by 7:00 PM on November 8.</u> Voted ballots can be returned by mail or dropped off at a Voter Service Center or Ballot Drop Box within your county. Visit https://elections.hawaii.gov/voter-service-centers-and places-of-deposit/. Ballots received after the deaedline cannot be counted.
- 6. Sign up to receive ballot alerts. Avoid missing the ballot return deadline by signing up for free ballot alerts! Visit hawaii.ballottrax.net or call (808)453-VOTE (8683) for assistance with enrolling. You can choose to receive text, email, and voice alerts for when your ballot is on its way, and reminders to return your ballot as the deadline approaches.
- <u>7. Assistance is available.</u> If you're in need of assistance with casting your ballot, consider the following options:
  - <u>Visit a voter service center</u> to cast your vote using accessible voting equipment. For more information, visit: https://elections.hawaii.gov/voter-service-centers-and-places-of-deposit/.   - Request an alternate format ballot and mark your ballot using your personal compatible device. Voters with special needs may opt-in for the electronically transmitted ballot through the Online Voter Registration System or by submitting a Voter Registration Application. Remember, you have the right to ask for assistance in the registration and voting process. If you need assistance completing a voter registration application, using the Online Voter Registration System, or marking ballot, you are permitted to have a trusted individual, like a family member or caregiver, provide you with the help you may need.

Be mindful that to maintain the integrity of the election process, Hawaii law does not permit your employer, an agent of your union, or a candidate to provide assistance.

# SIGN UP FOR STATEWIDE FLEX ALERT NOTIFICATIONS AND HELP STRENGTHEN THE GRID

Did you know you can make a difference when it comes to rotating power outages? This summer, as temperatures rise and there is higher energy demand, you can help prevent rotating outages by conserving energy when a Flex Alert is called.

Flex Alerts are triggered by the state's power grid operator, California ISO, when demand for energy is expected to exceed what is needed to power the state. This is particularly true in the summer when more Californians turn on their air conditioning, which puts more demand on the grid.

When a Flex Alert is called, customers are asked to voluntarily postpone higher energy-consuming activities until the Flex Alert has ended. This action could help the grid when it's especially stressed and help avoid rotating outages. Simple steps, like turning off unused lighting or precooling your home before a Flex Alert begins, can make a big difference.

The Youth Transition Service Coordinator performs various duties in support of Access to Independence mission as well as all programs and may also have unique duties and responsibilities associated with a particular grant.

#### Qualifications:

- Lived experience; preferred
- · Associate's or Bachelor's degree in a related field; preferred but not required
- Bilingual, American Sign Language certified; preferred
- Successful clearance of Background/DOJ Live Scan and proof of a valid driver's license and current automobile insurance and/or ability to get around the community as necessary

- Establishing trusting, collaborative relationships with consumers to help them achieve their goals
- Identifying consumer skills, training needs and other resources
