

BOLTON-LE-MOORS CAR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS 2024



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1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Welcome

- 1.1.1 Welcome to the 2024 Bolton-le-Moors Car Club Ltd (BLMCC) Championships. The aims of the championships are to give every club member the opportunity to compete for an award, regardless of whether they are a competitor, a marshal or a social member, and as always to encourage involvement in and development of the club.
- 1.1.2 2023 saw another fantastic year for BLMCC, whose competitors managed to earn the club a respectable third overall in the ANWCC inter-club championship.
- 1.1.3 BLMCC wishes all competitors, marshals and social members the best of luck for the 2024 championship. Without your continued support the club would not have been able to grow to the size it is today.

1.2 General Regulations

- 1.2.1 The championships will run in accordance with the General Regulations of Motorsport UK, incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA, these Championship Regulations (CR) and any written instructions that the organising club shall issue throughout the year. In the case of any dispute, the English text of these CR will be binding.
- 1.2.2 These general regulations apply to all the championships.
- 1.2.3 The championships will run from 1st January 2024 to the 31st December 2024.
- 1.2.4 The championships are open to all full members of BLMCC. Registration will not be required.
- 1.2.5 To claim points, competitors must enter events under BLMCC and where event regulations allow, competitors must display current club logos on both sides of the car.
- 1.2.6 All points must be claimed by providing the relevant Championship Coordinator with a copy of the final entry list and results for the event within two months of the results being declared final. Where the coordinator obtains the results from another source e.g. Internet then they will award points to all BLMCC members starting the event. However, it is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that points are awarded for each event they enter. No points will be given after the two-month cut off.
- 1.2.7 Where four or more entrants who are BLMCC members start an event of Clubman status or higher a 'Best Bolton' award will be made to the highest placed competitor in the overall classification. In the event of a crew of two or more BLMCC members competing, all members of the crew shall receive a 'Best Bolton' award if applicable.



- 1.2.8 In the event of classes being amalgamated you may claim points for your original class. It is your responsibility to inform the championship coordinator if this applies to your results.
- 1.2.9 Current championship positions will be published on the BLMCC website.
- 1.2.10 The image of Bolton-le-Moors Car Club must be upheld at all times by entrants, competitors and their teams, both before, during and after events. Any entrant, competitor or person(s) and organisations associated with bringing any disrepute to Bolton-le-Moors Car Club will be regard with disfavour and the matter will be presented to the committee for formal action.

1.3 Point Scoring

1.3.1 Points will be awarded for each event based on class positions using the following formula (unless specified otherwise):

((S+1) - C)*100	S=Number of starters in class
S	C=Class Position

- 1.3.2 In the event of there being less than three starters in a class then 75% of the points calculated above will be scored. If the class has been amalgamated on the event then your points will be awarded from whichever class gives you the highest points.
- 1.3.3 Additional points will be awarded to each competitor who starts an event depending on status as follows:
 - Clubmans 10 points
 - Interclub 20 points
 - National 40 points



2.0 ALL ROUNDERS CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

2.1 Categories

- 2.1.1 All events of Clubman status or higher in the following categories will be included in the championship:
 - a) Autosolo
 - b) Autotest (PCA)
 - c) PCT
 - d) Hillclimb
 - e) Race
 - f) Rallycross
 - g) Sprint
 - h) Road Rally
 - i) Stage Rally
- 2.1.2 Club members activities in the following categories will also be included in the Championship:
 - j) Marshalling
 - k) Social Events
 - I) Navigational Events

Specific Championship Point Scoring

- 2.2.1 Points will be awarded for categories J to L in respect to that relevant championships scoring system.
- 2.2.2 Competitors will be able to count a maximum of 16 scores, with the breakdown as follows:
 - A maximum of 6 scores from one of categories A I;
 - A maximum of 4 scores from any other of categories A I;
 - A maximum of 2 scores from each of categories J L.
- 2.2.3 To qualify for the All Rounders Championship competitors must compete in a minimum of 2 different categories from list A I and a minimum of 1 category from list J L.

- 2.3.1 There must be a minimum of 10 competitors for this championship to stand
- 2.3.2 Awards will be presented at the annual awards evening to the champion and runner up.
- 2.3.3 Ties will be resolved in favour of the competitor claiming points in the largest number of categories. Any further tie will be resolved in favour of the competitor with the highest claimed first score.

3.0 OFF ROAD, SPEED, ROAD RALLY AND STAGE RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

3.1 General

- 3.1.1 Where three of more competitors enter three or more events in the same group of categories then they will qualify for a championship for that group as follows:
 - Off Road Champion Categories A, B and C
 - Speed Champion Categories D, E, F and G
 - Road Rally Driver and Co-Driver Champion Category H
 - Stage Rally Driver and Co-Driver Champion Category I
- 3.1.2 Points will be awarded as outlined in regulation 1.3. with exception to category H which will include class position and overall position (Class plus overall divided by two).
- 3.1.3 Competitors will be able to count the following maximum number of events:

Category	Maximum counting events	
A, B, C, D, E, F, G	8

3.1.4 Points cannot be claimed for trophy or practice events that are run for retirees from events.

3.2 Marshal Scores

- 3.2.1 Any competitor who qualifies for a championship, as defined above, and is an official on a BLMCC run event in the same category they will score the same number of points as a class winner. Competitors may only claim full points as an official on one event in each category.
- 3.2.2 Any competitor who qualifies for a championship, as defined above, and is a signedon marshal on a BLMCC run event in the same category they will score half the points as a class winner. Competitors may only claim half points as a marshal on one event in each category.
- 3.2.3 Competitors may not claim both a full points and a half points score within the same category.

- 3.3.1 Awards will be presented at the annual awards evening to the champion and runner up (subject to 4 qualifiers in the group).

4.0 MARSHALS CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

4.1 Eligibility

4.1.1 Members will be given the opportunity to be involved in every type of marshalling duty, on any event organised by BLMCC or recognised by Motorsport UK.

4.2 Points Scoring

4.2.1 Points will be awarded as follows:

•	Full day on club organised or invited event	100 points
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- Half day on club organised or invited event 50 points
- Full day on non-club organised event 50 points
- Half day on non-club organised event 25 points
- 4.2.2 There is no limit on the number of events on which points may be claimed.
- 4.2.3 Full day scoring will be defined by anyone who carries out any duty for over five hours in any one day.
- 4.2.4 Half day scoring will be defined by anyone who carries out any duty for up to five hours in any one day.

- 4.3.1 Awards will be presented at the annual awards evening to the champion and runner up.
- 4.3.2 A cash prize fund of £500 will be divided amongst all members who are eligible (rounded to the nearest pound).
- 4.3.3 To be eligible for a cash award you must marshal on a minimum of two club events, or club arranged trips, and score a minimum of 120 points.
- 4.3.4 The Championship Coordinator is:

5.0 SOCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

5.1 Eligibility

5.1.1 Members will be given the opportunity to be involved in every type of social event.

5.2 Points Scoring

- 5.2.1 Points will be awarded as follows:
 - 100 points for 1st O/A down to 10 points for 10th O/A
 - Organising a social event
 - First time event organiser bonus 100 points
 - Writing an article for BLEMAG 100 points
 - Participating in a social event 10 points
- 5.2.2 Anyone organising and competing on a social event may only claim one set of points.
- 5.2.3 There is no limit on the number of events on which points may be claimed, though only five organising scores may be counted.

- 5.3.1 Awards will be presented at the annual awards evening to the champion and runner up.

6.0 PLAYSTATION CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

6.1 General

- 6.1.1 The PlayStation Championship will consist of up to 10 rounds throughout 2024. The dates of the rounds will be circulated on the club website and social media pages throughout the year.
- 6.1.2 Points will be awarded as follows, with the best 8 rounds counting:
