Progressive movement begins in 1880's


"Cathedral of Humanity" a collection of reformers who served the underserved, and addressed civic and state legislation.


Funding dominated by the private sector, some local taxes.

Jane Addams Hull House a progressive social settlement aimed at reducing poverty by providing social services and education to working class immigrants and laborers.

The goal was to bring the rich and the poor in close physical proximity in an attempt to bring social interconnectedness.

(1913-1921)


Wilson branded the Democratic party as the party

quality of individual lives.


The 16th Amendment created the Federal income

The GOP controls the White House and congress (1922-1933)


Warren Harding ran on a platform of returning to "normalcy."

Franklin Delano Roosevelt (1933-1945)

FDR closes banks passes Federal protection on money in banks.

Addresses the public with confidence and a plan to rebuild. Began Fireside chats.

The first New Deal. Expanded government with regulations and federal agencies that would better protect the citizens.

Second New Deal Roosevelt
Improved use of national resources
Security against old age, unemployment and illness, and slum clearance.
National Work Relief program replacing direct relief efforts.
Programs that redistributed wealth, income and power in favor of the poor, the old, farmers and labor unions.

Bombing of Pearl Harbor by Japanese.

World War Two starts expanded our technology greater to more efficiency.

FDR authorizes dropping the Atomic bomb, ending World War Two. He passes in a month,

Truman assumes the presidency.

America loses its innocence.



Jane Hoey, brought national attention to the profession of social work as director of the Bureau of Public Assistance from 1936 to 1953.

Expansion of government blossomed into regulatory agencies and services that assisted those in need.

Expansion that built this country, began to create a safety net for the citizens.


As the country expanded so did the role of the social worker. Many aspects of this expansion interfaced with social workers.





Harry Truman (1945-1953)


Truman shocks everyone and wins the election.

Continues FDR's progressive policies.










Dwight David "Ike" Eisenhower

John Kennedy "New Frontier" policies, a bold vision for America.

Government was further expanded, more regulations and a full frontal assault on poverty.

Community Mental Health Act passed. 1963 and Kennedy was assassinated within months LBJ assumed the presidency.



Richard Nixon (1969-1974)

The Kennedy/LBJ administration sparked a large backlash to government spending and costs of the Vietnam War. Lead to large budget deficits.

Unemployment was low, but interest rates were at their highest in 100 years.

Nixon implemented a series of economic controls to combat high interest rates that later created a recession.

He appealed to what he later called the "silent majority" of socially conservative Americans who disliked the hippie counterculture and the anti-war demonstrators.

Ended the Vietnam war

"New Federalism" Using block grants to fund the States giving them local control.

Created the EPA and OHSA.

Proposed HMO's to control healthcare costs.

Pro-equal rights.

Spiro Agnew resigned due to charges of corruption. Gerald Ford replaced him.

Oil Crisis October 1973-August 1974.

Returning Veterans a beginning opiate crisis. PTSD seen at new levels.


Woman's Movement.

Social workers used in hospitals and other community clinics.


Daytop residential drug treatment begins.


More people are using therapy.


Social Workers work in various government agencies.

The privatization of social work practices also grew, giving social workers greater autonomy and legitimacy.









Gerald Ford
(August 1974 to January 1977)


Gerald Ford first person to hold the Vice

Country is trying to stabilize after protests war and assassinations, resignations.







Lower taxes.


Larger military.



Bankers, investor Charles Keating took advantage of loosened restrictions on banking investments.


This process began in 1980 and was notable by 1986.

Presented a threat to the GOP.







Workload in agencies has everyone doing the jobs of three people, serving very high need clients.


