What is GSI?

The Gaza Scholarship Initiative for Displaced Students (GSI) is a coalition of volunteers – writers, academics, artists, professionals, and concerned individuals – supporting displaced undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral students from Gaza.

Our initiative aims to save Palestinian futures by securing full scholarships and academic support for these students from Gaza who are determined to complete their higher education.



What is the issue GSI addresses?

Rebuilding Gaza's educational infrastructure will take over **10 years**.

80%

of schools in Gaza were damaged or destroyed in a campaign known as 'scholasticide.' 60%

of educational facilities were damaged or destroyed, including 13 public libraries.

colleges and universities were completely destroyed.

715K

students are without accessto education, including90,000 university students.

GSI Mission

The **Gaza Scholarship Initiative (GSI)** supports displaced Palestinian students from Gaza who must seek education abroad.

Our mission is to empower Gaza's brightest minds to contribute to rebuilding Gaza's educational sector.

By investing in these students now, we aim to create future leaders who can eliminate the need to leave Gaza for quality education.

GSI also supports academics and initiatives working to restore academic learning in Gaza, both virtually and otherwise.

GSI Objectives

01

Secure scholarships, university placements, and other forms of support for displaced Palestinian students from Gaza, covering tuition, room, board, living expenses, and other assistance where possible.

04

Ensure mental health support is provided to students inside and outside Gaza and provide students' access to support groups and communities near campus.

02

Secure evacuations of students in Gaza matched with scholarships at universities and colleges abroad.

05

Enable students to return and help rebuild Gaza post-graduation.

03

Facilitate and secure living expenses, visas, and airfare for students in transition between evacuating Gaza and arriving at their places of study.

06

Assist and collaborate with initiatives aiming to restore/rebuild Gaza's education sector.

GSI Students

As of February 2025, GSI worked with **300+ Palestinian students** from Gaza. Of these students, **133** have been supported in their academic endeavors or matched with scholarships for the 2024-2026 academic years.

GSI Achievements

GSI is engaging with a network of global universities — spanning North America, Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and Asia — to secure academic support and scholarship opportunities for students to pursue undergraduate, graduate, and post-graduate degrees.

What Assistance Do Students Require?

Despite many universities offering full scholarships, GSI still need support for:



Evacuation-Emergency Expenses

Needed to evacuate
43 students, and to
keep them safe in the
period between preor post- evacuation
and the start of the
academic year.



Student Visa Application Fees

Most scholarships do not cover visa application and processing fees required by students' destination countries.



Set-Up Costs

Health insurance Registration fees Laptops Clothing Textbooks, etc.



Partial Tuition/ Room and Board

Certain placements offer only partial tuition support and/or partial or no support for students' housing and food (room and board.)



Stipends/ Other Costs


Monthly living and other expenses that are not covered by universities and scholarships.



Operational Costs

Three staff members and volunteer stipends, and other basic operational expenses

Urgent Funding Needs



Evacuation, Pre-and Post-Evacuation Costs:

To facilitate evacuation and care for 37 displaced students in Gaza pre- and post-evacuation

(\$105,000)



Tuition/Room & Board:

For students with partial scholarships


(\$300,000)

For **18 students** not covered by scholarship support


(\$21,000/academic year)

Staff, volunteer stipends, other operational costs



GSI's Current Financial Summary

In 2024, GSI raised:



Institutional Support/ Scholarships

\$400,000+

Funds for Ancillary Study Expenses



Covering critical needs such as room, board, health insurance, set-up fees, evacuation and visa fees, and airfare

GSI needs to raise:

\$626,000

to cover pending expenses for the current cohort of displaced students until their expected graduation


