
BIRTHDAYS ARE SPECIAL AT HOSANNA HOME!

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!

2 Corinthians 5:17

If you look up the word "Addiction" in the 1828 Webster's American Dictionary, you'll find the definition as 'the state of being devoted.'

Strange that today's Merriam Webster's online dictionary defines addiction as a strong inclination to do, use, or indulge in something repeatedly.

When God gave the children of Israel the 10 Commandments, the first one says "You shall have no other gods before me." In other words, He wanted His children to be devoted or addicted to Him only.

Today, there are many things human beings are devoted to and most of these things bring destruction to the lives of the devotee and those around them.

But we are not without hope!

For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people. It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, while we wait for the blessed hope—the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good. These, then, are the things you should teach. Encourage and rebuke with all authority. Do not let anyone despise you. Titus 2:11-15

This is the message of Hosanna Home. This is what we strive to teach to every lady that comes to us for help.

"Whoever will call on the name of the Lord will be saved" (Romans 10:13), Paul went on to discuss the importance of those who preach the gospel: "How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a preacher? How will they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, 'How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news of good things'" (Romans 10:14-15).

The Hosanna Home Program

Hosanna Home is NOT a homeless shelter, nor is it a drug/alcohol treatment center or rehabilitation program. We have no clinical expertise in overcoming addictions, mental illness or criminal behavior. Hosanna Home is a second chance program that introduces women in transition (where something has ended in their lives) to a Biblical world view that strives to bring hope, freedom from addiction and a new way of thinking-Jesus' way of thinking.

Romans 12:2 says

"Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is--his good, pleasing and perfect will."

The program is six months in length and tries to instill the Biblical principles that lead to a safe, character-building practice of life. Each resident is provided with a place to stay, clothing, meals, laundry facilities and opportunity to look at their choices from a different perspective. The first month's program fees are free. She is provided with staff that aids with goal setting, resume development, job search assistance and budget guidelines when a job is secured. In month two through six, residents agree to pay a \$600 program fee which she can receive a matching gift of up to \$1500 if she also saves that amount during her stay. Since everything she needs (not everything she wants) is provided to her, saving, though not easy, is attainable.

Residents attend Bible Study classes, Life Skills teachings, Celebrate Recovery (12-step Christ-centered meetings) and monthly recreation events.

Matthew 28:19 says:

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you."

This is the calling that Hosanna Home adheres to - making disciples that obey the commandments of Jesus. We desire that all ladies that come to Hosanna Home see Jesus in all that we do. Unfortunately, not everyone who comes finds the road easy - but it is definitely eternal!
