


















# New windows brighten up Historical Society

The installation of "new" old windows at the Dundalk-Patapsco Neck Historical Society is now complete.

The windows of the historic building at 4 Center Place, which is included on the Baltimore County Landmarks List, were damaged by vandals in December of last year. The building first housed The Dundalk Company - the original mortgage holder for all of Old Dundalk and later the Dundalk Public Library.

Plans for the replacement and repair of the windows had to be approved by the county Landmark and Preservation Commission before work could begin. 





Water For Chocolate Dining Room buildout: (left) before construction, (middle) during, and (right) after construction.




















