By definition, the term Whatnots is used to refer to "an item or items that are not identified but are felt to have something in common with items already named."

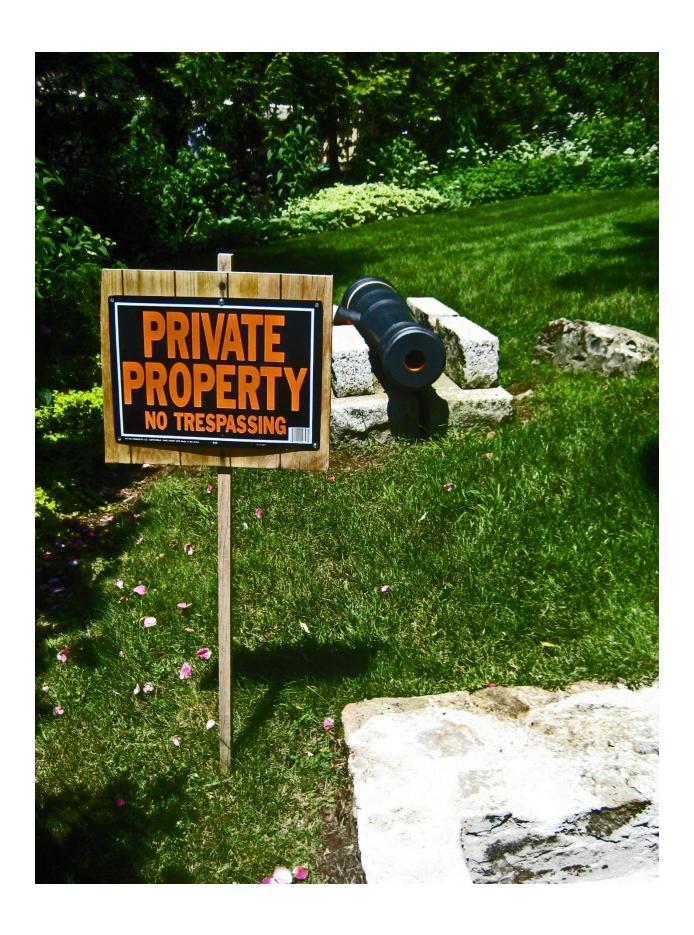
I've heard the term "whatnots' for as long as I can remember. I heard it just the other day by a mover telling his crew "this is the place for the stand, the equipment and whatnot."

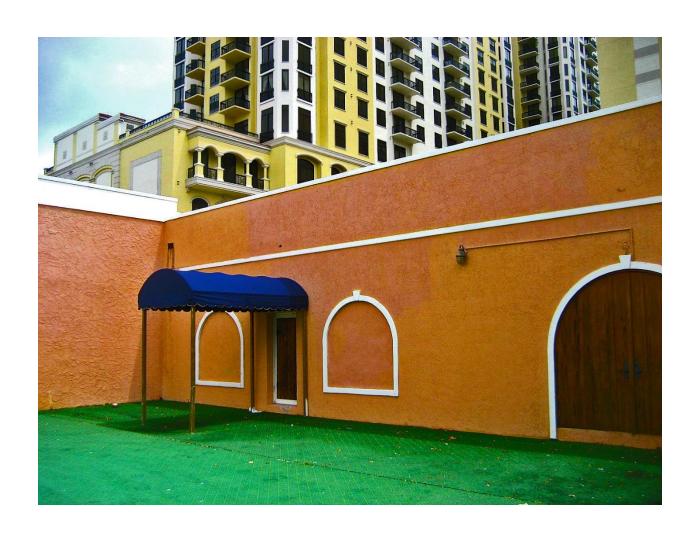

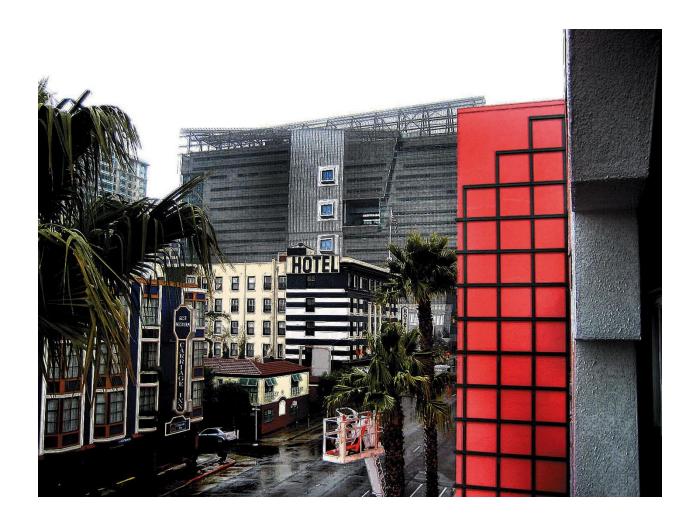

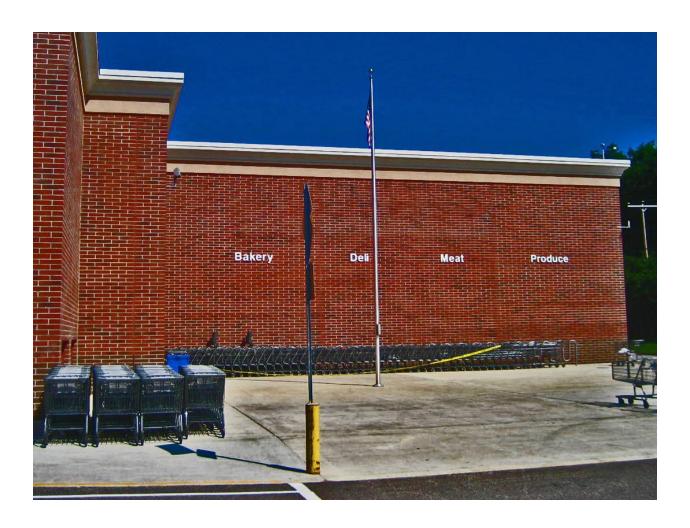

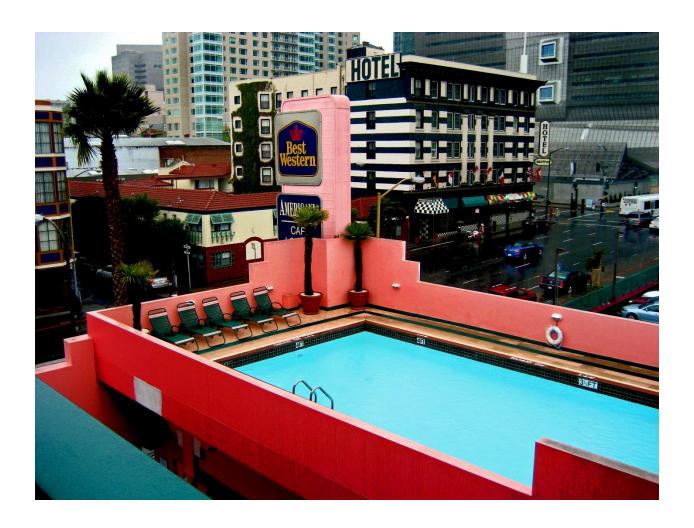

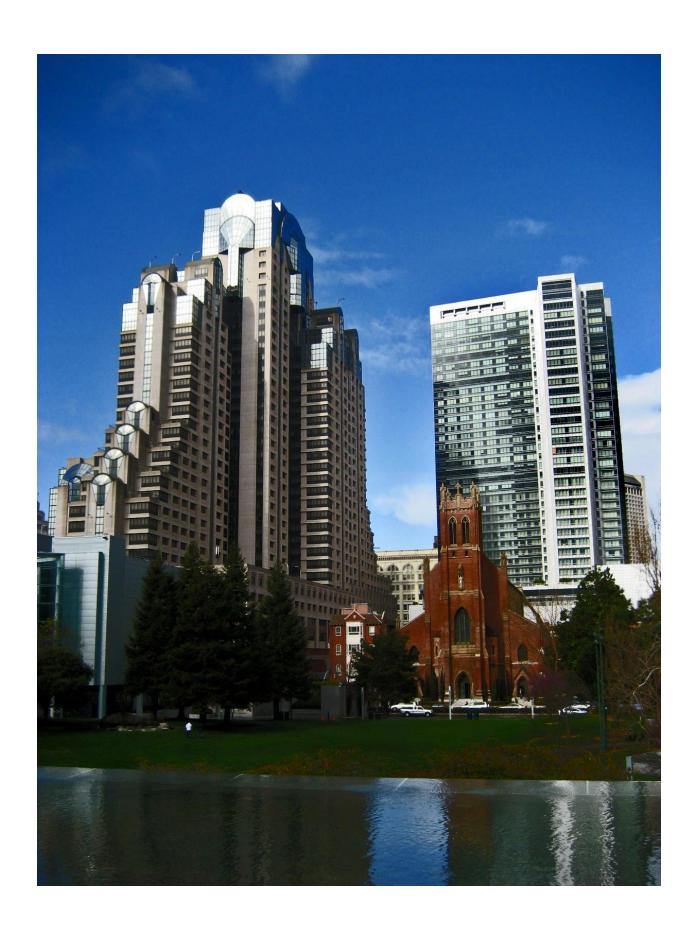
