Our core values are guided by RAI – Respect, Agency, and Inclusion. We understand these values to stand for:

Respect is demonstrated when everyone is welcome and accepted without bias and prejudice. Respect honours a person's identity in a supportive, fair, open minded and understanding environment. Respect is critical to people's sense of wellbeing and the foundation to positive working and learning experiences.



Agency is reflected by the time taken to listen to a person's values and opinions and by empowering them to make choices and decisions about matters that are important to them. Everyone is also supported to be involved in joint decision making to have their wants met.

Inclusion is when everyone is treated as an individual with equitable access and to participate in all areas of our service. Everyone comes with diverse experiences and strengths that are supported to contribute towards a positive environment.
