Today's Pick 5 Analysis

Ep. 44 of Pacific Horseplayers covered the Pick 6 instead of the Late Pick 5 this week, including the GI Del Mar Debutante. The consensus was that it was pretty much a two horse race between Explora and Himika, but after that opening leg you are met with some seriously difficult races. Even though I have a very strong opinion in the Juvenile Fillies Turf, that race is as difficult as it gets. After the Mabee, there's a chance it could be formful to end the day, but allocate your resources carefully.

Below are today's Price / Spot Plays. These are not usually the favorites, but horses we like that will provide some value (typically 5-2 or higher in general). The "Stars" rating is 1 – 5, with 5 being the MOST CONFIDENT / RECOMMENDED PLAYS.

The last time I touted a first time starter was Third Beer, who got up just in time to win, so let's try to replicate that success with #6 Honey's Choice. Bought at the OBSAPR sale for \$280,000, D'amato kept her down at Los Al to train, which isn't atypical of him to do. She was brought over to Del Mar early and has trained a few times down there, one of which was with Innovative, a proven 3yo filly who finished second to Thought Process and was a winner last out right here at Del Mar. I thought she went just as good as the older stablemate, and maybe even better. I expect a big run from her at first asking.

THIS IS MY PLAY OF THE ENTIRE MEET AT DEL MAR!!! There's a little story behind **#5 South Bay**. I was fortunate enough to do a handicapping seminar at Del Mar with Frank Scatoni on August 2nd, the day that this filly made her debut. I had her picked third that day, mainly because I thought being a daughter of a Curlin mare and such breeding, she would be better suited around two turns, and that her debut was more of a prep than anything. Right before we went live, a gentleman who is a part of Little Red Feather and a co-owner of South Bay came up to me, and in our conversation, he basically implied that she was going to be something special. After I saw how she won first out, I'm aboard that train. She broke a little slow, but reengaged quickly, moving up to stalk in the pocket up the backstretch. Around the far turn, she made a middle move to draw alongside the leader without being asked at all. She made quick work of the pacesetter, but you could tell she was super green in the lane. She was lugging in and she was on the wrong lead, and once she switched over to that correct lead, she strided out beautifully in the final sixteenth. Ever since she crossed the wire, I have been waiting for her to come back, and this spot in the Juvenile Fillies Turf was the optimistic target I was hoping for.

I was not a big fan of hers at all last time in the Yellow Ribbon, but that effort she showed has me joining her camp. There was no speed whatsoever last time, and there doesn't look to be a ton today, but I thought she ran huge considering the pace dynamics. Not to mention, she was in a bit of a tight spot in the early stages of that race, and she had to swing out wide for the stretch drive. She's second off the bench, and the extra sixteenth should benefit her as much as anyone in here.
