Today's Pick 5 Analysis

Friday's Late Pick 5 at Del Mar offers bettors another intriguing sequence highlighted by the \$100,000 Real Good Deal Stakes, a seven-furlong test for California-bred or California-sired 3-year-olds that figures to be one of the most competitive races on the card. The stakes feature brings together a well-matched group with several improving sophomores, making it a race where opinions could pay off in a big way. Outside of the feature, the sequence includes a blend of maiden events and allowance races that should provide plenty of opportunities for price horses to spice up the payouts.

Below are today's Price / Spot Plays. These are not usually the favorites, but horses we like that will provide some value (typically 5-2 or higher in general). The "Stars" rating is 1 – 5, with 5 being the MOST CONFIDENT / RECOMMENDED PLAYS.

Everything in this race is contingent on what we get from the speedy Long Mayshe Reign. She's definitely the horse to beat, but now she's gotta try to clear from the outside, and it might be difficult to replicate that last figure off short rest. I'm going to try to beat her with Invincible Molly, whose best races come when she's able to get that pocket trip stalking on the inside with some cover. She's had success with that same trip here at Del Mar before, and the hope is with the inside draw she gets that once again. The price should stick since she was somewhat well beaten by Lady Rider last time, but now she's fresh, and to me, her experience at this configuration puts her squarely in the mix.

THIS IS MY PLAY OF THE DAY AT DEL MAR!!! Princess Jet is a second time starter for the Peter Miller barn, who is only 8% with FTS versus the 22% clip he hits at with second time starters. I thought there were severely things to like about her debut despite the fact that she was well beaten. For starters, she was bothered at the break, then tried to split rivals and got shuffled back, then dove down to the rail only to receive a plethora of kickback, and at one point looked like she had a chance to make some noise. She kinda threw in the towel after that, but she ran in spots, and you know she's going to be much more fit this time around.

Gold Foot falls under an interesting category of horses that come over for the Ship and Win bonus yet stick around on the West Coast after an unsuccessful first try. There's no stats to suggest this, but just from following Del Mar over the last several years, it seems to be an angle that works pretty successfully. If the public is going to be a bit harsh on his performance last time, I'm a bit more forgiving because the field was so spread out he was a bit out of his comfort zone. Based on some of his prior races, he seems like the type to be a presence early and stay up there late. I know he hasn't won in a while, but most of those races are on the synthetic, in a variety of different barns, and most importantly against better company.
