Howard's Late P5 Analysis - Races 7-11

Today's Late P5 at Gulfstream has two stake races, a handicap (basically minor stake race), and two challenging allowance races...all solid fields. Up-and-coming star Knightsbridge should be tough in the G3 Mr. Prospector with the scratch of White Abarrio. The biggest spread races for me would be R7 and R11, the bookend allowance races. I'll be taking stands in R8 and R10, while going skinny in the 5f turf stake in R9. This is a VERY PLAYABLE sequence that you should strongly consider betting.

Notes:

This \$100k Tapeta Handicap race, basically a "Grade 4" race if one existed, has a speedy horse on the outside ridden by Irad, the #8 Prevent. My big opinion, other than my top choice, is that I'll be fading the #8. One reason why I like #2 **Bail Us Out** is because there's more quality in this race than the one Prevent is coming out of, plus Prevent got away with murder on the lead in a slow pace, and I have hard

time believing that will happen today. Popular, gregarious S. Fla. owner Michael Iavarone has private-purchased many horses for this meet, and Bail Us Out is one of them. He's classy and fits the profile of this race as a talented closer. He's been very effective on synthetic at Woodbine and GP. If Zayas times it right and there's even a little early pace in the race, I think he'll be tough here at around 9-5. You could single him too if aggression is your forte. Like his local works too...he should be ready off the small layoff.

This is PURELY AN UNDERNEATH PLAY, which worked very well for us last week when Sir Greyland finished 2nd at the Fairgrounds to give us a 10-1 exacta, and Public Assembly finished 3rd to score a nice trifecta...you DON'T have to predict who will win every race, as underneath horses can be just as effective. #7 Playmea Tune is the only true closer in a race that could have some early, especially if #3 Wound Up and/or #4 Super Chow pushes the early pace. He was in this race last year and ran a credible 5th, but was up closer to the pace and on the inside when taking dirt. Now, he's on the outside and can sit back and make a clear run. Plus, this edition is easier than last year with White Abarrio scratching. I'll be keying him in 2nd and 3rd in exactas and tri's. For our tip sheet ROI, I'll go \$1 Win and \$3 Place. My tip sheet ROI play will be a straight \$2 exacta 2-7. I might place an "insanity" win bet just in case too. If the #3 & #4 hook up early with the #2, it could fall apart into the lap of Playmea Tune.

THIS IS MY PLAY OF THE DAY AT GULFSTREAM PARK!! Last week's Play of the Day at Gulfstream worked out well as Public Defender, at a price, finished underneath as predicted to give us a nice trifecta. Today, I hope **#8 Modarosa** does the same, but I think she's a more likely winner than last week's horse. I'll be in the walking ring and if given the chance, I'll personally tell Junior to GUN from the gate and go as fast and far as he can...one slow quarter, and look out. She's a talented horse who ran well enough off the layoff last time, and she's bred for the turf and has talent. Obviously, she's had issues with the long layoff, but now she's 2nd off the bench and has two nice works since, so she should be tighter. Her main competition prefers to come from midpack or behind, so I'm hoping she gets loose early, slows down the middle half of the race, and hangs on for dear life late. Look for me in the Winner's Circle on the simulcast feed, with a big smile on my face, if Modarosa wins the last at GP!!

Howard's Late Pick 5 Analysis – Races 7 - 11

The Opening Day Late P5 today will have a MASSIVE pool, one of the biggest of this year for sure. It's a MUST PLAY if you're a horizontal player, but it won't be easy. My biggest spreads will be R8 and R9, two VERY tough races. I'll go skinny / take stands in R7 and R10, even those are not easy races either. I'd spread as much as you can in the last race, but for me your decisions start and end with the Euro #10. I'm against, but obviously she's classy....is this the proper distance for her? Good luck finding a single in this Pick 5.

I really enjoy watching and betting the downhill 6 ½ furlong races at Santa Anita. **#1 Anmer Hall** is very logical here and the fastest horse on paper consistently. Fresu knows the horse well, and he'll get the right pace setup. The main problem is the rail...that's NOT the place to be going down the hill, but with the rails down, there's more room for him to maneuver through the big field. If he can work out the trip, he has a big shot...I would NOT take too low a price on him on the win end however...5-2 would be my minimum odds.

Notes:

The 1 1/8th G3 San Gabriel is a tough race, but is lacking early speed on paper. **#9 Cabo Spirit** likes to be forward, this is mainly a pace play. Am I worried that he's on the downswing after his last poor effort? Absolutely yes. But I'll trust the trainer here to have the horse ready, and there are no killers in this field. He has plenty of races to go back to class-wise, and Smith has ridden him several times. Distance should NOT be a problem, and might actually help him stretch out since the pace in theory will be slower. I expect him to sit off the #6, go by, and hang on late in a thrilling finish.

THIS IS MY PLAY OF THE DAY AT SANTA ANITA! #8 Cornucopian has had an interesting career. The \$1.1mil colt by Into Mischief started his career with a bang, and was the buzz horse of the spring, until he wasn't. After two disappointing efforts, Baffert brings him back in a VERY aggressive spot, as he's eligible to run in an N1X. But, he's been working in an UNREAL fashion, outworking stablemate and competitor Barnes last time. What I like most are two things: 1) He gets an outside post and should sit just off the speed comfortably if he breaks well, and 2) Baffert takes the blinks off and has clearly taught this horse in the morning how to sit and finish. Can he do that Sunday vs. very talented runners when it matters most? We're gonna find out! I think he can rate if necessary and is uber-talented. He better have his running shoes on today. Fun race...hoping Cornucopian lives up to his price tag today.

I would watch the toteboard at the beginning of the sequence, as Leg 1 has some talented first-time starters...let's see which ones are taking money. The key for me is the last race of the sequence...I'm taking a stand with the rail horse, but to be honest, it's a tough race with several contenders.
