Today's Pick 5 Analysis

This sequence was discussed on Episode 38 of Pacific Horseplayers, so if you haven't checked that out already, go do so. If it's not the 6 in the opening leg, it could be just about anybody. The San Diego is Nysos' race to lose, but the Bing Crosby is a fantastic race with a loaded field, arguably the best sprint race we've seen up to this point. It's hard to imagine there not being a hot pace in the 10th, and hopefully it sets up for a spot play down below. The 11th and final is a wide open affair. Good luck!

Below are today's Price / Spot Plays. These are not usually the favorites, but horses we like that will provide some value (typically 5-2 or higher in general). The "Stars" rating is 1 – 5, with 5 being the MOST CONFIDENT / RECOMMENDED PLAYS.

Notes:

First thing's first: **#3 Broski** does not seem to want to get his picture taken, and I expect a regression from his last race. Sondereker Racing LLC purchased **#4 Tempus Volat** back in May for \$180,000 at FTKMAY, and it looks like they did it with the purpose of taking advantage of these increased purses in maiden races this summer. He was closing in a very preppy debut, and career start number two was on a yielding turf course where he was in between horses early, wide around the far turn, and was won by a wire-to-wire winner coming out of a super live race at Fair Grounds. According to DRF, his works aren't great, but those are on dirt and are no different than



his previous works while in the Asmussen barn. He's a turf horse through and through, and Powell is 21% 1st time with a new acquisition in the last 5 years.

THIS IS MY PLAY OF THE DAY AT DEL MAR!!! #2 Imaboutago (Ire) and #10 Pushiness have to duel, right? And the main reason I believe that is because Pushiness is also trained by Michael McCarthy, therefore making Pushiness unratable. If you toss her only two-turn effort, she's got several really good turf sprints on her resume, and are certainly good enough to win this race if things go her way. The only concern for me is the layoff, but she's been training for a good while leading up to this race, and Rispoli takes the mount on her instead of Pushiness, who he's been on nine consecutive times. Lots of things in her camp on Saturday, and I expect a big effort from her.

I think it's only appropriate that I give a play in the Bing Crosby considering its extreme difficulty. There is no doubt in my mind that on everyone's best day, **#5 World Record** is the far superior animal. In a race that has a lot of speed, he's very versatile, but I envision him sitting a beautiful trip off of **#3 Hejazi**. His two-back race at Churchill was spectacular, and even his last race is way better than it looks. He got into a suicidal duel with Skelly, who was nowhere to be found late in that race, yet World Record stayed on and was only beaten a length in the end. If he gets the trip I envision, he's gonna be really tough to beat. Some possible betting scenarios were floated around on our show Thursday, and if he's not favored, a large win bet will be placed.

We talked about **#1 Suchet** for probably a lot longer than we should have Thursday night, so if he doesn't run well in the finale, it would be quite the disappointment. A foreign invader from France, he was running 103 Timeform numbers late last year as a 3-year-old, and it wouldn't be too far-fetched to assume that he's as good if not better now, which puts him squarely in the mix. 1st time lasix is always a big angle for me when evaluating these horses and their first start in the states. He's got a work over the Del Mar turf, and it was a solid one in company with Certitude, a nice turf router stabled here on the West Coast. Is it silly to suggest that if Hector Berrios were in town and this were to be his mount that he'd be much lower on the morning line? I certainly don't think so.
