**“Follow the Jockey”**  
**April 26th, 2026**

**Friday - Sandown, London UK**  
**Saturday - Morphettville, Adelaide, Australia**  
**Saturday - Randwick, Sydney, Australia**  
**Sunday - Sha Tin, Hong Kong**

The best flat racing in the UK this weekend is on Friday with Group races at Sandown. We start there. The races will jump a couple of hours after you receive this. The star attraction is Juddmonte's **Field of Gold**, winner of the Irish 2000 Guineas and most unlucky loser of the 2000 Guineas, when an overly confident jockey pressed the button a hot second too late. Gosden has hit the ground running and England is in the midst of a dry, sunny spell. We want a star and we want him to win. Your nocturnal entertainment comes from Adelaide. Australia's focus is Morphettville with the **G1 Australasian Oaks** and **G1 Robert Sangster Stakes** as well as 5 other Group races. **James McDonald** makes a rare trip to Adelaide (he's only ridden there once before and never won) before flying out to Hong Kong to ride Romantic Warrior on Sunday. Sunday also has the best horse in the World, **Ka Ying Rising** looking to break more records. Punting continues from Paris with Arc winner **Daryz** making his seasonable reappearance in France's first G1 of the season at Paris Longchamp. Next week, the focus is entirely on the English Classics, the 1000 and 2000 Guineas with the 2000 Guineas card live on Kentucky Derby day morning.

## **Sandown - FRIDAY**

### **R3 09:25 EST G3 Gordon Richards Stakes 10F**

**4 (5) Saddadd 4/1**

**3 Stars**

The older Middle Distance horses go at it here. Aimeric is a strong Fav and one I like, but one senses he needs softer than he'll get at Sandown. The play is therefore **4 (5) Saddadd 4/1** who graduated through the ranks for the Roger Varian yard last year and he showed he can play with the big boys when 3rd in the Foundation stakes. The horse has targets including the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom in June. Ray Dawson is back from a successful stint in Dubai. This horse was entered last week, but saved for this. King of Cities is nice horse and gets Ryan Moore, though that will impact the value. 3 Stars

### **R4 10:00 EST G2 Bet365 Mile**

**5 (6) Field of Gold 11/10**

**4 Stars**

**5 (6) Field of Gold 11/10** should need no introduction. He is the mind of many the best miler in Europe. His season is probably mapped out from here. Queen Anne at Royal Ascot, Sussex Stakes at Glorious Goodwood, Breeders Cup Mile at Keeneland and or Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin. This in theory is the time to beat him, but he has been hot in the market all week before declaration and keeps tightening today on the morning of the race. 4 Stars. The race has cut up before declarations. I did take **Cicero's Gift at 25/1** before declarations so a first three finish for the Charlie Hills horse works for me. Hills barn is famously hot early season.

## R5 10:35 EST G3 Classic Trial

5 (5) Spyce 16/1

5 Stars

Aiden O'Brien Action is the Fav, but his barn is cold. Gosden's barn is hot. It follows you would be inclined to take Wise Prince the Gosden 2nd Fav or one of the Applebys, but none appeal as Derby material. One further down the betting does, however. Alan King — as nice a man as you'll meet — is dual purpose trainer, mostly jumps. I was chatting with him in Liverpool a few weeks ago. His barn has been warm lately and here he sends out **5 (5) Spyce 16/1**, a horse that won an impressive maiden at Yarmouth beating Lighting Thunder (who ran a strong 2nd in 26 horse field at Newbury last week) and subsequently gave O'Brien's Pierre Bonnard and Appleby's Del Maro a serious examination when 4th at Newmarket on Good to Firm last October. King reaches for Tom Marquand. The horse will be fit as a butcher's dog. I think he is a 5 Star bet.

## Morphettville Saturday (first race, Friday night EST)

### R2 23:46 EST Friday, G3 6F

4 (2) Aragog 8/1

3 Stars

Penny dropping, late charge last time for this Stokes / Neindorf combo for Yulong. Needs to improve, but perfect draw in (2) to seize this. It has been hot in Adelaide, the rail is true. They'll be coming for the low draws. Will be shorter than 8s come race time. 3 Stars

### R3 G3 10 F

2 (1) McWoody 7/5

3 Stars

3 (7) Wigmore 8/1 is another Stokes / Neindorf combo, this time racing in the OTI colours. Last run a creditable 4th in the New Zealand Derby at massive odds. Now gelded. Cuts back two furlongs. A definite place contender. The Fav is the formidable and likeable yellow blinkered winner of the Adelaide Guineas over 9 furlongs, but **2 (1) McWoody** maybe too short at 7/5 given the extra furlong. It is a real dilemma. Can McWoody go the distance. Is this too sharp for Wigmore? I am inclined to play McWoody. 4 Stars. You may get 2/1 closer to the off given the marquee jockeys lining up. I may also use said two above in a Tri and box below the 5 (14) Engine of War and 6 (9) Flying Brant who have top raiding jockeys Mark Zahra and Craig Williams aboard.

### R4 00:57 am EST G2 Queen of the South Stakes 1 Mile

3 (1) Blindedbythelight

4 Stars

Luke Nolen flies in for his old "Black Caviar" trainer, Peter Moody, to ride **3 (1) Blindedbythelight** 12/5. A good solid Fav who ran big for a close 2nd when first up in a G2 at Rosehill last month. Generous early price as books try to balance the merits of the 2nd Fav On Display. However, I feel Should win this doing handstands. 4 Stars. (Also watch for the **9 (11) World's My Oyster 12/1** who is a great EW or place bet with Jacob Oppenman doing the steering for Henry Dwyer. 2 Stars.)

## R6 02:07 EST G2 Tobin Bronze Stakes 6F

2 (6) Tycoon Star 18/5

4 Stars

2 (6) **Tycoon Star 18/5** is the right Fav though he has trouble sealing the deal with only two wins to his name and 15% win strike rate for the 3 yr old Yulong colt, but those wins were in G3s on the superior Melbourne circuit, where the horse has a great place strike rate. The Hayes boys (sons of Ka Ying Rising trainer, David) are bringing this horse here 3rd up here for a seemingly easier field and got on the bat phone to James McDonald. He should prevail. 4 Stars

## R7 02:42 EST G1 Australasian Oaks 10F

11 (14) Kazaru 25/1

2 Stars

None of so called known Sydney or Melbourne raiders appeal despite the marquee jockey bookings, and although the temptation to play the Waller / McDonald Panova is strong, it has to be resisted. The horse is drawn 16 and although they'll fan across the track, it will be a monumental effort for her to get up. That said Panova should be included in any Trifectas or Quinellas. The best local form would be 5 (10) Mating Call with Jamie Melham back home to take the ride. The Fav is 2 (5) Getta Good Feeling for Melbourne's Danny O'Brien. She is the most likely winner, but I am not keen on 8/5 in a massive field. So I am reaching for a roughie here. The 4th place finisher in Mating Call's last win was **11 (14) Kazaru 25/1**. The trainer Philip Stokes was a long time trainer in Adelaide, but moved to Melbourne a few years ago. Kazaru was held up and was finishing strong late last time. The extra furlong will help here, as will the young in form jockey Lachlan Neindorf. The horse has winning form over further winning the Tasmanian Oaks (think winning a race in Puerto Rico). I'd advise an EW bet or a Place play. Maybe the key horse in a HHH back wheel Tri, if there is enough liquidity. 2 Stars

## R8 03:18 EST G1 Robert Sangster Stakes 6F

3 (1) Generosity 9/2

4 Stars

4 (3) Bernadetta 10/1

4 Stars

These are horses who all came up a buck short in the big Sydney and Melbourne sprints. Most of the main protagonists all have tough draws, particularly Point Barrow who drew the 16 marble, which is why he the 9/2 Fav, not 11/4 Fav. It's a great betting race. It is hard to get away from the James McDonald horse, **3 (1) Generosity** though I fear the **4 (3) Bernadetta** at the better price of 10/1. Bernadetta tried for an easier G1 at Perth's Ascot track back in December, but was bumped in running and ran no race. Ciaron Maher has returned the horse to the top table twice since and ran 8th and 6th in fast races, but never far away at the post and was always finishing strong. Last year's Melbourne Cup jockey Jamie Melham is a South Australian. This is her home. She wins big races including when James McDonald is riding. I am playing both of them. **4 Stars**.

## Randwick

### R4 00:30 am EST Handicap 6F

**6 (7) Emirate 12/1**

**5 Stars**

6 (7) Emirate 12/1 The main focus is the Adelaide big day, but I can't resist putting up this horse again. 2nd last time. Gets a good jockey in Jason Collett, soon Hong Kong bound. Good draw. Cut back may suit. Easiest field it has faced in some time. 5 Stars.

### R7 02:15 am EST Handicap 7 1/2 F

**9 (7) Shadizi 16/1**

**4 Stars**

9 (7) Shadizi 16/1 I am sweet on this former Aga Khan horse by Siyouni. Was never a top, too performer in France for Graffard, but a won listed races well enough at this distance in France. Good first up record. Well weighted. Well drawn. Has had a year to adapt to Australia. Off the radar screens. Waller turns to Collett again, which I hope will be a double. Follow the Jockey! Great value bet at 16/1. 4 Stars

## Sunday

### Sha Tin

#### R5 02:35 EST G1 Chairman's Sprint

**(8) Satono Reve 16/1**

**1 Star**

1 (3) Ka Ying Rising is the prohibitive 1/25 Fav. There is no beating in theory. But four of the world's best jockeys are in the race and are going to give it a go. João "Magic Man" Moreira is on Japan's best sprinter, **2 (8) Satono Reve 16/1**, a horse that once got within 3 lengths of Ka Ying Rising. He is top form is a good EW bet at 16/1. I am going to throw a few speculative shekels on Satono Reve. 1 Star.

#### R7 03:45 EST G1 FWD Champions Mile

**1 (5) Jantar Mantar 9/4**

**5 Stars**

**1 (5) Jantar Mantar 9/4** is a worthy Fav and a knocking bet. Yuda "King" Kawada makes the trip from Japan for the race. There has been vet questions about Voyage Bubble and Sunshine Power. Lucky Sweynesse is back in form, but is only in this division to avoid Ka Ying Rising. Docklands is a plucky global competitor and his Queen Anne win over Rosallion was no fluke, but this Jantar Mantar is a Godzilla like horse, as best show beating the best Japanese milers at Kyoto last November. Watch that race! He'll destroy them. Great Bet.

## R9 04:55 EST G1 FWD QEII Cup

### 3 (1) Royal Champion

3 Stars

This is such a great race. I am itching to take Romantic Warrior on. He is now a 8 yr old and he is three serious rivals from Japan, the UK and France. Let's examine all of them. Masquerade Ball is obvious top challenge. The highest rated horse to have ever shipped to China. Lemaire is in town. He ran Calandagan to a nostril in the Japan Cup. He seems to be taking money. However, I have a couple of concerns. His Summer target is the King George at Ascot in July — a mile and a half rematch against Calandagan. He had niggling injury this past Winter. And he has weighed in a few Kilos overweight. Yes, as I often mention, horses get weighed regularly in Asia. American punters have a biblical attachment to their PPs and yet one of the most important lines of data to help show of the well being of the horse doesn't exist in most jurisdictions. This is a serious rival to Romantic Warrior, but I am not playing given the said concerns and the price. Serious money has come for Sosie. She has halved in price and is now 8/1. I tipped him to win the Hong Kong Vase for the Wertheimers on these pages, but that was 2 furlongs further than Sunday's race. I was not a fan of **3 (1) Royal Champion** before the Riyadh race. I had thought his resurgence was a one off, but he is race fit unlike the others. Karl Burke's horses are in hot form this Spring. **It's the Each Way bet at 16/1. 3 Stars.** I am not playing Royal Champion to win, just Each Way and in the place market. This could be Romantic Warrior's Swan Song, though I am not playing at odds on. (Note: Jason Collett pops up in this race to start a stint in Hong King. I tipped him twice at Randwick, the day before. Follow the Jockey!)
