Today's card at Keeneland features the top race for 3yo fillies on the turf in the country, the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Invitational Stakes. Choose your spots wisely, as some of the horizontal betting can get pretty expensive...it does appear however that the later part of the card could be more chalky, we'll see!

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Late P5 Strategy/Analysis (R6 - 10)

The Late P5 today is highlighted by the G1 QE II S. Invitational, the premier race in the U.S. for the 3yo girls on the turf. There are two Euros in the race, and I like one of them much more than the other. We'll discuss later. As you can see by my grid, I'm going pretty skinny today. It's not that there are obvious big faves or singles, but I'm just taking stands. The ones in which I'm most confident are R6 and R7. That being said, my top choices are a long layoff horse and a first-time starter, so you can decide what to do with that info. I'd spread in R8 and especially R10 for sure. R9 there will be a 4-5 horse at post time, but I'm not so sure he'll get the job done.

\$3 Turf P3 Strategy/Analysis - R5, 8, and 10

Today's All-Turf Pick 3 is VERY difficult. That means you have to take some stands, or spend a boatload of cash. The first leg, Race 5, is a maiden race for 2yo's. I would mainly go 4-deep there. The 2nd leg is the Grade 1 QE II. I'm taking a stand on the top end with #10 Candala. But many others can win if she does not. The last leg is an allowance race for 2yr olds. I would have to use a minimum of 4 horses on the main line and could use as many as 7 horses. The best way to play this sequence, if you choose, is to use the ABC Method above and weigh your choices to soften the blow in your pocketbook.

Notes: Race 9 is a high-class allowance race for males. There will be a big, and deserving favorite, in the #11. But, as I talked about on the podcast Thursday, I could poke some holes in that one. #7 Ben Franklin is fascinating to me here. His last start looked every which way to be a prep for this spot. He was ridden very passively throughout, then asked in the stretch and made an ok run where the pace completely held together up front. He also slightly steadied on the backstretch. Trainer McPeck is known to give a horse a start off the layoff, and Ben was very good in the spring vs. these types. Other than the #11, who are you really afraid of here? There's plenty of early speed today, especially from the outside. And with a short run into the first turn, they'll HAVE to send from there. I expect a very honest pace, and hope Ben Franklin (with regular rider and first-call jock Hernandez for McPeck) will electrify (oh boy, you knew that pun was coming) the crowd in the stretch. This horse reminds me of one called "Commandperformance", who finished a strong second at HUGE ODDS when tipped out on these Power Picks last fall at this level. Use everywhere, including a bit on the win end too!

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Notes: Race 2 is a two-horse race on paper in my opinion. #10 Executive faced a decent field first out at Saratoga, losing to Early Adopter, who didn't embarrass himself in the Pilgrim in NY. That race was a WAYI race for the BC, won by Zulu Kingdom. Executive broke slow, but made a good run late to finish a close 3rd. A better start and more tactical speed would be beneficial to Executive.

Notes: There's plenty of speed signed on in this event, but Downtown has a big advantage in that he breaks from the outside and can look to his left and make a decision. He's naturally VERY fast, but has rated before just a tad. He's gonna have to run big today, but is very capable of doing it. I hope he sits off of the #5 and goes by. I would need a price higher than 4-1 to get himthis is a tough field.

Notes: French-bred #10 Candala is a horse in which I'm familiar. I actually saw her race in-person on my trip to Europe this past summer. She has been facing very tough competition in France vs. the top 3yo fillies in that country, and she's fallen a bit short. But, there are a few things I like today. First, the cut back in distance will suit, as well as the fast ground. The Frankel's (Candala's sire) tend to like it firm, and she's been on soft ground lately. Two-back, she got a brutal trip, as she was boxed in the entire length of the stretch and should have won. She has a nice turn of foot, but can be more tactical if necessary. The first part of the race is the key. Geroux needs to break decently, then get the filly "covered up" and hopefully be mid-pack. If those things happen early, she's got a big chance at a fair price. The 3yo Euro fillies are simply better than ours in my opinion.
