Jen grew up in Potsdam and graduated from the Crane School of Music. She spent 30 years in the music and theater world teaching vocal music in the Ogdensburg City School District. After retirement she decided it was time to pursue her interest in art. She is now an accomplished pastel & water color artist.

Classes at SOAR in graphite, charcoal, and water color started her journey into art. Classes in pastel during winters in Florida started her passion in pastel. This passion she likens to finger painting for adults" and provides a personal connection for her with the depth of colors, the subject, and the finished painting. The process of pastel painting is a long one, but it is her greatest joy and worth the time spent.

Nancy is a wool fiber/felting artist from Norwood. She has a degree form Clarkson University and spent her career working in business and administrative finance for over 40 years. Her true passion has been perennial gardening. After retirement she had to find a new passion so she settled on "wool painting as an art" referred to as felting. Her love of color in her perennial gardening led her to creating florals and landscapes with primarily an impressionistic style. She has won awards with them which inspired her to continue with this artistic medium.

Felting is a process of connecting wool fibers to make a fabric and is an ancient art. It is the earliest known textile, predating weaving or spinning. Most of her pieces are made using Merino sheep's wool along with Corriedale sheep's wool, sheep's locks and silk fragments which

> Tina Siebel is an accomplished silversmith jeweler. She is the owner/designer of Serendipity Creations. She started in jewelry making with beads in 2005 with her mother and sisters. She took the first of many silversmithing classes in 2014 and was hooked. She took private lessons at a studio in Smyrna Beach, Florida, where she lives in the winter. She now has her own home studio and does her own design, fabrication, and stone setting in sterling silver and Argenitium. Tina's jewelry can be found in galleries, stores and arts festivals in several states. She also mentors young jewelry artists in the art.

Yvonne was born in Ontario, Canada and majored in Fine Arts at Sir Sandford Fleming College where she was able to venture into many different art forms. She finally settled at oils as her art of choice. She and her husband, Jim, also a certified instructor, taught oil painting classes in Arizona for 20 years. She was also asked by the university to teach painting at Arizona State University in Tempe.

Yvonne experiments with the capabilities of all sorts of oil creations from the unrestricting strokes of the pallette knife to slashing paintings into strips to re-create unique woven canvasses with fractured images that she calls Oil Mosaics. She teaches monthly Watercolor Pencil Painting at The Gallery which introduces students to the art of painting. She also stitches her paintings into one-of-a kind fashion totes.

Yvonne and her husband live on the St. Lawrence River near Ogdensburg. Planting, tending and harvesting her vegetable gardens has become a joyful threeseason pastime when she isn't doing her "art thing".







St. Lawrence County Advances Sport Tourism Initiative with Key Next Steps, including Sport Tourism Group Formation

CANTON, NY - The St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce, in collaboration with Cimarron Global Solutions, is entering the next phase of its sport tourism initiative. With strategic direction now established, the project is moving into the implementation phase, ensuring that by September 2025 when the grant-funded project comes to a close, the County will be positioned to continue selfadvancing long-term sustainability and growth in the sport tourism sector.

Sport tourism has been identified as a key economic driver for the region, and the initiative aims to leverage St. Lawrence County's existing assets to support established community events while also attracting and hosting a variety of new opportunities. Based on alignment with industry standards, stakeholder reviews, an asset inventory assessment, and community feedback analysis, the initiative will focus primarily on three priority tiers, including college and professional sporting events, youth and amateur sporting events, and amateur sporting events including outdoor recreation that use our abundant trails and water-

One of the most important next steps in the project is the formation of a Sport Tourism group, which is intended to include representatives from all facets of the sport tourism experience, from asset managers and event planners to lodging partners and industry leaders. The Chamber will be holding targeted meetings in mid-April with various stakeholder groups and leaders to begin piecing together committee membership and representation. These meetings will serve to explain the objectives and potential functionality of the formation of a sport tourism group and will touch on defining roles and responsibilities for all involved parties. The meetings will also be an opportunity to gauge membership interest and gather critical feedback from those who are directly involved in this growing industry.


"After so many months spent laying the groundwork and strategizing, we are thrilled to be taking real action now," said Tiffani Amo, Director of Tourism at the St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce. "Forming a Sport Tourism group is a pivotal step forward, and we hope that these upcoming meetings will help us lay the foundation for a sustainable and collaborative effort that will help shape and drive sport tourism in the region for years to come."

While meetings have already been scheduled with key stakeholders, Amo says there is still an opportunity for interested parties to come forward.

"Our outreach is by no means exclusive or exhaustive. If there are individuals in the County who want to be included in these upcoming meetings, we want them to reach out to us so they can participate too," Amo said.

A St. Lawrence County Sport Tourism Toolkit has also been developed to help current and future stakeholders get involved and understand how they can contribute to the initiative. In the coming months, a sustainable funding approach will also be developed to ensure long-term viability of sport tourism efforts. Additionally, marketing assets will be created to promote St. Lawrence County as a premier destination for sporting events, and an evaluation model will be established to forecast potential impacts and measure the success of sport tourism efforts. Finally, recommendations will be made for industry memberships and engagement opportunities to further enhance marketing and knowledge-building.




