Our Classroom Structure

At Lighthouse, every classroom is built around the educational and therapeutic needs of the student. The Guide leads instruction and curriculum, while the Classroom Lead Therapist and Registered Behavior Technicians—under the direction of a BCBA—work directly with students to implement behavior plans and teach adaptive skills.

Therapists deliver in-class support when it best serves the student, connecting therapy directly to instruction. This integrated model blends curriculum, therapy, and behavioral support so each child can learn, grow, and thrive.
