## Friends Groups of the Year Announced

PCBL has named **Arthur's Friends/Hufnagel Public Library of Glen Rock** and **Friends of the East Penn's Valley Library** as 2025 Library Friends Groups of the Year.

Arthur's Friends was nominated by Kathy Heisler of the Hufnagel Public Library of Glen Rock for their intensive efforts to raise funds needed to restore their beloved library after a water leak, subsequent mold, and then asbestos that was discovered during the clean-up process. Arthur's Friends moved furniture and books to areas of the library not affected by the flooding, then got busy with an all-out effort to raise the \$140,000 they would need to make their library usable again. In her nomination, Kathy wrote, "In a small town like Glen Rock, our Library is the center of town. People depend on us for more than just books." As of July 10, 2025, Arthur's Friends had raised \$130,000 towards their goal of \$140,000. The Library is still closed, but very close to achieving its fundraising goal so that repairs can be completed and this vital community asset can reopen.

Brady A. Clemens and Denise Sticha nominated the Friends of the East Penns Valley Library for keeping their library open through fundraising and a 100-percent volunteer staff after being closed by the Centre County Library System in 2012. Without the volunteer efforts of the Friends of East Penns Valley Library, residents of eastern Centre County would have no physical access to a library. Open 15 hours a week, the East Penns Valley Library is located in the former East Penns Valley Elementary School, now the Millheim Borough Building. In his nomination, Brady A. Clemens wrote, "While simply running the library is a job all by itself, the Friends don't merely stop at circulating and fundraising. The Friends sponsor a number of programs throughout the year." 
