2023 Tax Forms Due

2023 Affiliate Member Tax Packets were mailed to all PCBL affiliates to be completed and returned. Forms can also be found on our website at https://pcblpa.org. Affiliate tax forms for 2023 are due on or before March 1 to maintain the \$125 membership fee. Those returned after March 1 but on or before April 1 will have an increased membership rate of \$175. Those received after April 1 will not be included in our group return. This is to ensure that our group return, which includes all of our affiliates, is returned on time.
