

Application Checklist – Group Tax Exemption

1.	Membership Form

2.	Copy of IRS EIN Designation Letter - Application can be done online here: https://tinyurl.com/z7gb9pd
3.	Copy of your bylaws, which needs to include specific IRS required wording — The IRS required wording can be found here: https://tinyurl.com/m6ajc9y
4.	Copy of the meeting minutes that your group officially voted to become an Affiliate of PCBL
5.	Copy of your most recent financial statement (quarterly, monthly, or annual)
6.	Letter of Authorization — After your acceptance as a PCBL Affiliate Member, you will be required to submit a year-end financial statement for the annual 990 filing. This letter authorizes the PCBL to include your financial information in the year-end filing. Your revenues and expenses will be lumped together with all of the other Affiliate Members and your individual group finances will never be shown.
7.	Articles of Association - This is the document by which the IRS verifies that you are entitled to fall under PCBL's Group 501(c)(3) Tax Exemption. - This document can be found on our website under "Affiliate Membership".
8.	\$150 Check — This annual fee covers your Affiliate Membership for the year, January-December.

All information should be submitted with the signatures of individuals having authority to act on behalf of your organization.
