

Elks National Foundation, Inc. By Connie Frere

Elks National Foundation, also known as ENF, was created in 1928 to serve as the charitable arm of the Elks. The mission of the Elks National Foundation is to help Elks build stronger communities. We fulfill this pledge by investing in communities where Elks live and work. We help youth develop lifelong skills, send students to college, meet the needs of today's veterans, support the charitable work of the state Elks associations, and fund projects that improve the quality of life in local Elks communities.

This past year alone, ENF distributed \$36.4 million in grants nationwide, and they have budgeted \$45.3 million for 2024-25. The money was distributed across Community Investment Programs, State Projects, Hoop Shoots, Drug Awareness, the Veterans Service Commission, Veterans' Homelessness, and Scholarships.

As far as our Lodge and our State association go, Kent Island Elks Lodge was approved for all of the grants we requested, totaling \$9,000. This money was donated to Haven Ministries' community programs and the continuation of our local Giving Closet program.

The MD-DE-DC State Association received a total of \$425,710. This money was distributed across Camp Barrett, Drug Awareness, Hoop Shoot, Soccer Shoot, educational programs, 14 MVS scholarships, 7 Legacy scholarships, and the Elks National Veterans Service Commission. In fact, our state association received \$1.62 for every \$1 donated last year. Your money counts.

Our goal this year is to reach a \$25 per member donation, as well as increase Fidelity Club Memberships.


