

DRUG AWARENESS PROGRAM

MD, DE, DC Elks Continue Annual Drug Take Back Efforts

Drug Take Back Day is still a major tool used by DEA and Elks Drug prevention programs to help eliminate drug abuse opportunities in our communities. Thank you to those Maryland and DC Lodges who held a Drug Take Back event or national night out events in their communities.

Locally, the DEA Washington Division, which includes the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia (DMV), reported collecting over 27,656 pounds between 303 locations. Our local Elks Lodges proudly share in collecting a sizeable portion of that take-back number. We collected roughly 600 pounds Association-wide.

Jarod Forget, Special Agent in Charge of the Washington Division, commented, "our team is grateful for the collaboration and hard work demonstrated by our local and state partners in successfully establishing and managing more than 300 collection sites. Their efforts have significantly created a safer and healthier environment for everyone. By disposing of these substances responsibly, we are taking a crucial step towards preventing them from being misused or ending up in the hands of those who could use them for illegal activities."

For more than a decade, DEA's National Prescription Take Back Day has removed almost 17.9 million pounds of unneeded medications from communities across the country. Elks Drug Awareness Programs are front and center in those efforts and continue to be out in front as an all-volunteer asset to national drug abuse prevention organizations and the DEA.

Removing unnecessary medications from the home can help prevent situations involving not taking medicines as intended or dosed, taking someone else's prescription, and taking the medicine for euphoric effects rather than medicinal purposes.


DEA continues to expand opportunities to make safe disposal of medications more accessible nationwide. They encourage people to remove unnecessary medications from their homes regularly and dispose of them at one of the nearly 17,000 permanent drug drop boxes located in communities across the country. Safe medication disposal receptacles and DEA Take Back events provide families with accessible, no-cost opportunities to eliminate unnecessary medicines stored in the home. KI Lodge will be holding another Drop in the spring.
