

THE BPOE DRUG AWARENESS COMMISSION AND OUR CONTINUED RECOGNITION OF RED RIBBON WEEK

Red Ribbon Week encourages our entire community to adopt healthy, drug-free lifestyles. The Elks Red Ribbon Week campaign brings together parents, schools, and businesses as we look for ways to keep kids and communities drug-free.

In 1985, Drug Enforcement Administration Special Agent Enrique S. "Kiki" Camarena was tortured and killed by drug traffickers. Shortly after his death, citizens from his hometown of Calexico, California, began wearing red ribbons to remember him and commemorate his sacrifice.

The first official Red Ribbon Week celebration was created by the National Family Partnership in 1988. Soon after its creation, the BPOE joined the NFP and other organizations in promoting the Red Ribbon campaign for families, schools, and communities nationwide each year.
