WEED CONTROL

As you are all aware we have a considerable number of weeds in our chain of lakes. Most are not invasive but are still a nuisance. The channel was treated and keeps the center of it open to navigation. We did not treat for Curly Pond weed this year. Hopefully, another grant opportunity will be available from the DNR for 2023. There will be a survey of the entire chain of lakes this summer for Eurasian Milfoil that will be early August. The results will be available as soon as they are received by the GLA board members. We do know Eurasian milfoil is present in our chain of lakes we need to have a specific plan to hopefully eradicate it.

Water Quality

This winter water quality and means to keep our lakes in great shape will be studied, any opportunities for funding will be researched.

Water Levels

I know that is a concern. Our chain of lakes water level/elevation is controlled by a weir of rocks in Goose creek and mother nature. It is important to keep this Weir maintained. Any damage or change will affect the elevation of our lakes.

What can we do?

I am still learning, as we all can. All the potential remedies have a cost, and it is expensive to keep our lakes in great shape. But a simple thing we can all do is participate, get our neighbors to join the GLA, participate in fundraisers and pay our dues.

A note from...MN Lakes and Rivers Advocates

Each year Goose Lake Association pays due to be part of MN Lakes and Rivers Advocates (MLR). MLR is the largest, most generous and most committed conservation/angling group in Minnesota. MLR and its member Association have contributed about \$6.25 million towards lake work collectively, about 1.2 million volunteer hours to protect the public waters, and almost \$400k for annual fish stocking. Individual and Association memberships are available.

What is One Thing You Can Do Today to Protect the Lake You Love?

The answer is to join Minnesota Lakes and Rivers Advocates, (MLR) if you are not a member already. There is no other group in Minnesota that does so much to protect the lakes and rivers we all love. As Bernie Steves, President of the Otter Tail County AIS Task Force, says ***“No group has done more to protect water than Minnesota Lakes and Rivers.”***

Your membership in Minnesota Lakes and Rivers Advocates provides a significant Return on Investment. MLR has successfully lobbied to lower property taxes on lakeshore, create grant programs through DNR that support lake association programming, trainings and education from the Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Research Center for lake home and cabin owners, and technical assistance from local units of government to support property owners and lake associations.

When our members told us they were seeing more boating conflicts, dangerous boating, damage to shorelines and lake bottoms, and rude boating behavior, MLR took action.

Last year we worked to ***fund research (\$160k) at the St. Anthony Falls Lab***, the oldest fluid dynamics lab in the US, to study the height and energy of different wakes, from an 18 foot runabout to a wake surfing boat. The study was released in February. Check the blog section of the new MLR website (<https://mnlakesandrivers.org/>) to see the released study.

Last fall we worked to build a broad base of partners, including Hennepin and Goodhue County sheriffs, the National Marine Manufacturing Association, Marine Retailers Association of the Americas, the Community of MN Resorts, Tonka Bay Marina, and MN DNR in ***support of a new boater education and certification requirement.***

- Minnesota is one of only 8 states without a watercraft certification program,
- Boating deaths broke a decades old record the summer of 2021,
- Boating sales of paddle craft and larger pontoon and wake surfing craft have been up over 30%, escalating conflicts among user groups,
- Training will include Best Practices for safety, reducing user conflicts, preventing the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species, preventing damage to shorelines from wake action and protecting lake bottoms from prop thrust.

During the pandemic more and more people bought lakefront property to self isolate. More sales created a spike in the value of shoreline. The resultant increases in property taxes are now starting to show up on proposed property tax statements. This is resulting in a rise in market driven property taxes. ***MLR is working this session to create a state buydown to offset these market driven tax increases.***

MLR has gotten calls about both the cost and red tape lake associations must navigate to manage aquatic invasive species in infested lakes. The DNR does not typically take any action to treat AIS once they are in a lake, yet the DNR has stringent and costly permitting requirements. Local governments and lake associations bear the cost of lake management and are required to do the planning and execution of the work. Lake home and cabin owners like you pay the costs directly through contributions to your lake association or through local property tax levies. MLR took action, we:

- **Surveyed Lake Associations about the DNR aquatic plant management programs** to document the issues. You can find a report of the results on the blog on our website.
- **Lobbied to create a \$850k grant program** for lake associations working to control AIS.

MLR has launched four programs as well in our efforts to protect your lake and river heritage and investment. While COVID-19 disrupted our pilots last summer, we had good feedback and impact and will work this summer to expand them.

- **Stop Starry** - with funding from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund, MLR is providing boat cleaning stations at the public accesses of lakes infested with Starry Stonewort so boaters can Clean, Drain and Dry as they leave. This will lower the risk of AIS spread to the lake you love.
- **Lake Steward** rewards and recognizes property owners who have preserved their shoreline and supports those who want to restore their shore.
- **Up the Creek Meats** connects lake associations with meat producers in their watershed that use regenerative agriculture practices and work to protect water in their operations. You can buy food directly from producers that farm in a way that protects the water in
- **Project WET** is a national program that trains people and provides curriculum so they can engage audiences from classrooms to fair booths to Chamber of Commerce events. Education is the first step in protecting our lake heritage.

MLR's mission is to, "Protect Minnesota's lake and river heritage for current and future generations by forging strong links among lakes, lake advocates and policy makers." ***Our strategy focuses on four legs: (1) advocacy at the Minnesota Legislature, (2) promotion of aquatic science, (3) education and organization of lake home and shore line owners to create a strong advocacy base, (4) professional media outreach to get your issues and accomplishments into local and state media.***

We cannot do this work without your generous contributions. Unlike most conservation groups, MLR receives the majority of its funding from individual members like you. There is no other group so focused on the issues important to you and we have a long track record of success.

By joining MLR you will receive communications on our legislative efforts, action alerts that make it easy for you to contact your legislators on important legislation, an invite to our annual "Water Connects Us All" annual meeting as well as free webinars and events. But more than that, you will be supporting the statewide lake group that does more to protect the lake and the good times you have for the future.

GOOSE LAKE ASSOCIATION BYLAWS-DRAFT

2022 Revisions

ARTICLE I. NAME AND LOCATION

- SECTION 1. The name of this Association shall be: GOOSE LAKE ASSOCIATION 501c7
- SECTION 2. The principal office shall be located at: PO Box 221, Harris, MN 55032

ARTICLE II. MEMBERS MEETING

- SECTION 1. There will be two member meetings per year: "Spring" and "Fall". The Spring meeting will be held the first Saturday after Memorial Day. The Spring meeting will be designated as the "Annual Membership Meeting", by which annual dues for the year are to be paid. The Fall meeting will be held the first Saturday in October.
- SECTION 2. Any *special meetings* of the members will be held at the same place as the member meetings. A special meeting may be called at any time by the President and, in their absence, by the Vice President; or by the members. The purpose of a *special meeting* shall be: to take on a project where membership dues will be used to pay for the project over \$4000.
- SECTION 3. Notice of the time and place of all member meetings and special meetings shall be mailed by the Secretary (or designee in Secretary's absence) to each land address. Member name(s) will appear on mailings based on last record with the Association.
- SECTION 4. The President or Vice President (or in their absence, an elected officer) shall preside at all such meetings.
- SECTION 5. At every such meeting, each household in attendance who is in good standing and has paid membership shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote.
- SECTION 6. A quorum for the transaction of business at such meetings shall consist of a simple majority.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS AND AREA REPRESENTATIVES

- SECTION 1. The officers of this election association shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected for the term of two (2) years and shall hold office until their successors are duly elected and qualified. The President and Treasurer will be elected on years ending in an even number; Vice President and Secretary will be elected on years ending in an odd number.
- A volunteer Web Administrator will be voted on and approved by the Officers for an undetermined time limit. Any Officer may duly serve the role of Web Administrator if the membership votes so.
- The business and property of the Association shall be managed by the President or other designated officer.
- SECTION 2. The President shall preside at the members' meetings. The President shall have general supervision over the affairs of the Association and over other officers. The President and Vice President shall review records of the Treasurer annually. The President shall execute instruments on behalf of the Association, and shall perform such duties as are incident to their office. In their absence, the Vice President shall perform the duties.
- SECTION 3. The Vice President shall understand all duties of the President, in case of absence or inability of President to fulfill role. President and Vice President shall divide responsibilities as mutually agreed. The President and Vice President shall review records of the Treasurer annually. The Vice President shall assist in coordination of Area Representatives.
- SECTION 4. The Secretary shall issue notices of Association meetings and shall attend and keep the minutes of the same; shall have charge of all association records and papers, excluding financial records. The Secretary (unless appointed to

Web Administrator or other volunteer member) shall complete and mail the bi-annual newsletter to each member to the last known address of said member as the name appears on the books of the Association at least ten (10) days before the date of all annual meetings. The Secretary shall keep possession of current and previous 'essential documentation'. The Secretary shall perform all such duties as are incident to their office.

- SECTION 5. The Treasurer shall have custody of all monies of the association's general account and sign all checks. Only the Treasurer, plus either President or Vice President, has the authority to open or close any bank account or other account (i.e. investment). The Treasurer is responsible for gathering information to present to the Board to determine what type of account(s) are in the best interest of the Association. If the account should be the type to carry any risk, a vote of majority must be gained by the membership. The Treasurer shall keep regular books of account; shall have charge of all corporate book records and papers; and shall submit them with all vouchers, receipts, records and other papers to the Officers and as often as they may require. A Treasurer's report of debits, credits, and balances shall be given at each Association meeting. The Treasurer shall be responsible and execute instruments on behalf of the Association related to the filing of all tax returns necessary to keep the Association in compliance with federal and state tax filing requirements; and shall perform all such duties as are incident to their office.
- SECTION 6. Vacancies to Officers for the unexpired term can be filled by any paid member in good standing for interim service until membership can vote at the next Association meeting.
- SECTION 7. The Web Administrator shall maintain the Goose Lake website (www.gooselakemn.org). The Web Administrator may assist in maintaining membership records. If appointed by Secretary, Web Administrator may complete and mail the bi-annual newsletter to each member to the last known address of said member as the name appears on the books of the Association at least ten (10) days before the date of all annual meetings.
- SECTION 8. Nine (9) Area Representatives shall be appointed: Northern Pines, Hilding Beach, Holiday Shores, Sterling Hills, Oxbow, Cambridge Lake Estates, Rolling Shores, The Narrows, and Barber Drive. Each Area Representative shall reside or have land ownership in the area they represent. Area Representatives shall welcome new community members; communicate actions of the Goose Lake Association; encourage membership and help support receiving of dues of area landowners; and be good stewards of the Association.
- SECTION 9. Officers and Area Representatives shall make every effort to attend Association meetings.

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP

- SECTION 1. The membership in this Association shall be limited to the owners of property and residents surrounding the Goose Lake Chain of Lakes (North Goose, South Goose, Oxbow, Mandall, and Roubar) shall be bounded by, the South Side of County Road 7, to County Road 8, West of County Road 8 to County Road 63, North of County Road 63 to County Road 62, East of County Road 62, to County Road 7, which is located in Fish Lake Township, Chisago County, Minnesota.
- SECTION 2. The Association is to be supported by dues of thirty-five dollars (\$35) per year per household address to be paid at the annual Spring meeting. Members may also mail a check and Membership Application form to the Association address. If the dues are not paid during each meeting year, the member will forfeit membership.
- SECTION 3. The funds of the Association shall be deposited in such bank as the Officers shall designate and shall be withdrawn only upon the check or order of the Treasurer or President. Whereby approval of Members will be sought for all expenses, prior approval of the paid membership is only required for use of funds if amount exceeds \$4000.00.
- SECTION 4. All services and time of the officers and area representatives shall be donated.

ARTICLE V. AMENDMENTS

Amendments of these bylaws may be made by a vote of the members representing a majority of members at any annual meeting when the proposed amendment has been sent out in the notice of such meeting.

I. Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 10:05 am by President Robbie Thum.

II. Guest Speakers: *Susanna Wilson and Camden Droppo Chisago County: Water Quality Monitoring, AIS Programming, and other water activities*

- Chisago comprehensive AIS program responsible for watercraft inspection, decontaminating, signage at launches, AIS education/outreach, enforcing state AIS laws, early detection programs with rapid response plans for treating if found
- County receives funding from state DNR and partner with comfort lake/forest lake watershed district
- 13 inspectors last year – completed over 18k inspections (19k in 2020)
- Inspectors complete a survey about boaters (lake visited prior, next lake) and educate boaters to prevent AIS
- Decontamination Unit – high pressure, portable, hot water wash unit to kill invasive species on exterior of boat to remove plants, animals, mussels, etc from outside of boat
- 93 decontaminations completed last year
- Inspectors look for drain plugs in boat or not (boaters cannot transfer water lake to lake), most boaters in county are complying
- Zebra mussels – if boats are found with these at inspection, they cannot launch until decontamination
- Enforcement – inspectors cannot issue citations; sheriff will inspect and issue citations/warnings when applicable
- Decontamination Unit – yearly decontamination blitz is outreach effort

with state DNR in WI and MN and The Wild Rivers Conservancy (St Croix River Association) on St Croix River; Unit is available for all and can be scheduled for use

- Bait disposal bins on East and West Rush; experimental program
- Zebra Mussel and waterflea program on Goose done to catch free floating with butterfly net
- Zebra Mussel watch program – 56 volunteers last year within the county; This year will be over 70; Need volunteer for N Goose & Mandell (DONE at meeting)
- 1/month water access monitoring system at all launches with double sided rake to look for new invasive species; Coordinate with DNR if something new found
- Starry Stonewort Trek event – statewide 3rd Sat in August, to search lakes, coordinated thru DNR
- Invasive fragmites – focus on southern part of county; semi aquatic plant growing along lakeshores and in ditches (can be spread thru mowing); identify, map and treat countywide with roadside surveys. Working with UofM – Fishlake Township survey done 2 years ago
- Childrens Water Festival avail for all 5th graders in county – in person in September;
- Volunteer opportunities available
