NPC Organizations Stand Up To Harvard



On December 3rd, sororities, fraternities and students filed two lawsuits - a federal suit and a state-level suit in Massachusetts - against a Harvard policy that aims to punish individuals who claim membership of single-sex, off-campus organizations. These suits point to Harvard's use of intimidation to scare students into leaving their organizations, a violation of their rights outlined in Title IX and the U.S. Constitution.

The movement Stand Up To Harvard has the support of all 26 sororities in the NPC. The NPC organizations acting in the lawsuit are Alpha Phi, Alpha Phi - Iota Tau, Kappa Alpha Theta, and Kappa Kappa Gamma, as well as Delta Gamma Fraternity Management Corporation, a non-profit which supports Delta Gamma chapters. Other plaintiffs include Sigma Chi fraternity, Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity, Sigma Alpha Epsilon - Massachusetts Gamma, and three current Harvard men who are members of men's organizations.
