All remaining, unfilled spots will be filled by members of the rising new member class. If you choose to live in the house, rooms and house placement comes on a first come, first serve basis. If interest exceeds capacity, housing selection will go based on: GPA, Slated Positions, Positive Points, Seniority, and Campus Policy. If the rising new member class does not fill the facility, chapter members who have not met the live-in requirement (lowest GPA and newest member class) will be asked.

Sorority Residency Requirement

Members are required to live in the Chapter House for two semesters during their membership unless they qualify for exemption under specified conditions. Members living in the Chapter House are determined by application, if residency is not filled members will be chosen based on member status from a waitlist. A member is considered to have met the two-semester live-in requirement if she qualifies under one of the following conditions: 1) has lived in the chapter house for two semesters, 2) has submitted the Gamma Chi housing application, or 3) has moved into the chapter house to fill a vacancy (even if not for a full two semesters). Failure to satisfy this requirement will result in a fine of \$350 per semester, up to \$700 total.

Financial Assistance

Payment Plans: Payment plans are available for members who are unable to meet their dues obligations by the specified due dates. These plans are highly customizable to accommodate the specific financial needs of members. It is important to note that the total amount of dues remains unchanged; only the payment schedule may be modified.

Scholarships: Alpha Delta Pi offers various scholarship opportunities, including the Alice Combest Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship can be awarded once during the duration of a member's affiliation and can cover up to the full amount of one semester's dues.

Member Organization Fees

Badge Fee:	Each member organization has a distinctive badge or pin. This fee is for the organization's pin which can range from simple to ornate and customizable based on the member's preferences and budget. Badges may be very simple or jeweled. If a member is purchasing her badge, she determines how much or little she would like to spend.
Initiation Fee:	One-time payment prior to initiation to support membership commencement procedures
New Member Fee:	One-time fee to establish membership in the organization prior to initiation commencement. New members get to experience special events including a new member sleepover and other bonding activities to celebrate their decision to join our chapter.
International Fee	Membership fee paid to the national organization to fund operational costs and support sorority activities and initiatives for each member.

Chapter Fees

Chapter Dues:	These monies fund member activities including programming, recruitment, chapter supplies, chapter operations, social events, philanthropy events, sisterhood events, and any other special events including but not limited to rent food trucks, putting on concerts, Spring formal, attending local sports events, chapter dinners, etc.
Panhellenic Dues:	These funds are used to support Panhellenic operations. Examples of items that may be included in the Panhellenic budget are attending conferences, office operations, marketing and electronic media.

Facility Fees

Financial Assistance

Members can request to pay their chapter fees through an installment plan. The installment plan consists of payment of chapter fees in three, equal payments throughout the semester. This is \$356.7 per payment for the new member semester and \$250 per payment for current members. Additionally, members can apply for merit and need-based scholarships provided by the Delta Delta Delta sorority.

Members can choose to purchase the 10K badge for an additional \$95.00 (total cost \$210.00)
Per capita fee:	Fee paid to inter/national organization per member to support overall sorority operations.

Chapter Fees

Panhellenic Dues:	These funds are used to support Panhellenic operations. Examples of items that may be included in the Panhellenic budget are attending conferences, office operations, marketing, and electronic media.
Sisterhood Events:	These funds are used for chapter wide events that further the bond of women in the chapter such as sporting events, movies, and more.
Social/Special Events:	These funds are used for social and special events in collaboration with other Panhellenic sororities and fraternities such as Victory and Best of Both Worlds formals.
Philanthropy Fee:	For philanthropy, Tri Delt supports Cook Children's Hospital and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. This fee goes towards the sorority's association with the organizations



New Member Program:	These funds go towards Delta Delta Delta's new member education and events that aim to bond the new pledge class and allow new members to get to know each other and current members.
Chapter Operations:	These funds go toward the operational activities of the chapter.
Chapter Development:	These funds go toward member programming and activities.
Recruitment:	These funds go toward participation in recruitment and recruiting new members.
New Member National Fee:	This is a fee paid to nationals to establish membership in Tri Delt.

Chapter Fees

Assessment:	A chapter may vote to support an activity/event/cause that is not included in the chapter budget and the expense would be assessed per member.
Campus obligation	These funds are used when a chapter is asked to donate funds to other organizations and/or fundraising opportunities on campus.
Chapter dues:	These monies fund member activities including programming, recruitment, chapter supplies and chapter operations.
Composite:	An annual photograph is taken of each chapter's membership. This expense can be included in chapter dues or billed separately.
Initiation fee:	Fee paid to finalize initial membership in the organization.
Liability/risk management insurance:	This fee covers insurance-related costs for the safety of members, their guests and sorority property. Funds may also be used for special programming relating to risk management concerns on campus or within the chapter.
New member fee:	Fee paid to establish membership in the organization.
Panhellenic dues:	These funds are used to support Panhellenic operations. Examples of items that may be included in the Panhellenic budget are attending conferences, office operations, marketing and electronic media.
Parking permit:	Parking is typically limited at chapter houses. Spaces are allocated by each chapter to members based on criteria set by the leadership and/or chapter corporation.
Philanthropy fee:	Philanthropy fee: Each chapter has a philanthropy and some have local causes they support. This fee can be included in chapter dues or billed separately.
Purchase fund:	This fund is set up at the beginning of each term to pay for things not included in chapter dues. It may be used to purchase T-shirts, sorority paraphernalia or attend optional social functions.
Social fees:	Social functions not included in chapter dues are billed out individually based upon the cost of event(s).

Facility Fees

House corporation fee:	These funds are used to support chapter property and physical plant. Often this is a one-time fee paid prior to initiation.
Parlor/House usage fee:	The entire membership has access to the house and thus the property is subject to a great deal of wear and tear. This fee is used primarily for care and maintenance of the property and furnishings in the common areas of the chapter facility.
Security fee:	Special security staff may be employed to protect chapter property, members and guests. Typically, all members, not just those living in the house, would be asked to help cover this expense.

Financial Assistance

There are many scholarships available through the Kappa Alpha Theta national website as well as a payment plan that members can apply for, which breaks up semester dues into even installments over four months. In the fall, each member on a payment plan would pay \$189.75 in August, September, October, and November. In the Spring, each member on a payment plan would pay \$140 in January, February, March, and April. The installments are usually sent out at the beginning of the month and are due two weeks later. There is no penalty or fee to be on a payment plan, but each member must submit a reason as to why they are applying for one each semester. There is also no set number or maximum of girls who can receive a payment plan, and Kappa Alpha Theta is more than willing to make sure that the financial responsibility of our chapter is not a burden to the women in our sisterhood.

For women needing financial assistance, we can stack their dues, meaning they can pay two months together if they cannot pay one specific month, or they can pay their dues all at once during a particular month if that's more convenient. If the members' dues are paid before the end of the semester, it does not matter which month they pay. Additionally, members can apply for both need-based and merit-based scholarships through the Phi Mu Foundation, provided they maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA. Member Organization Fees

Badge fee:	Each member organization has a badge/pin. Badges range from simple to jeweled, with prices starting at \$65 based on chosen style.
Technology fee:	This fee is charged to develop and maintain online programs, publications, and services for communicating with the membership.
National collegiate dues:	Dues paid to the National Headquarters for members during the semester to handle expenses.

Chapter Fees

Member dues:	These monies fund member activities including programming, recruitment, chapter supplies and chapter operations.
Initiation fee:	Fee paid to finalize initial membership in the organization.
Liability/risk management insurance:	This fee covers insurance-related costs for the safety of members, their guests and sorority property. Funds may also be used for special programming relating to risk management concerns on campus or within the chapter.
New member fee:	Fee paid to establish membership in the organization.
Panhellenic dues:	These funds are used to support Panhellenic operations. Examples of items that may be included in the Panhellenic budget are attending conferences, office operations, marketing and electronic media.
Philanthropy fee:	Philanthropy fee: Each chapter has a philanthropy and some have local causes they support. This fee can be included in chapter dues or billed separately.
New member dues:	These non-refundable fees are paid monthly, quarterly, or by semester, depending on local chapter requirements, until the time of Initiation. New member dues contribute to the operating expenses and activities of the chapter.

Facility Fees

Housing/ Furnishing fee:	These funds are used to support chapter property and physical plant. Often this is a one-time fee paid prior to initiation.
Parlor Fee:	The entire membership has access to the house and thus the property is subject to a great deal of wear and tear. This fee is used primarily for care and maintenance of the property and furnishings in the common areas of the chapter facility.
