NPC Update: From the NPC Chairman: The Role, Scope and Authority of the College Panhellenic



Recently NPC Chairman Carole Jones released a statement reviewing what exactly "Panhellenic" is as well as its role in the college community. Carole states how Panhellenic is often misinterpreted as only the officers on the executive team and the FSL administrators and staff, but it is so much more. It is an association composed of each member of every NPC sorority on campus. Furthermore, there is also a College Panhellenic Council that is composed of a delegate and associate delegate from each NPC chapter represented on campus.

Carole Jones then goes on to speak on the role of Panhellenic which she states is "to guide, not decide." This distinction makes the delegate role of each chapter crucial as the women elected to this position must be knowledgeable on the rules and procedures of both their chapter and of Panhellenic in order for guidance to be provided by Panhellenic. In addition to this, they also have the important responsibility of sharing the opinions of their chapter as a whole on issues and ideas regarding the Panhellenic community. Finally, she concludes by defining the purpose of College Panhellenic which broadly is to promote growth of individual chapters, encourage high standards, promote

friendship and harmony, and so much more.
