

TIPS TRAVELLING TO/FROM MEXICO

LEAVING THE U.S.

STEP 1:

You can fill out the immigration papers *on-line* prior to your departure. The paper form is handed out on the plane for you to fill out prior to landing. If you would like to fill it out prior to departure, [click HERE](#) to visit the website to fill the form out in advance. Below is a screenshot example of the printed form.

Important! Be sure to print out the *completed form* out and take it with you if you complete it! This form will also be handed to Customs at check-in in Mexico along with your passport.

STEP 2:

Check in at airport. You will need to check-in with the agent at the desk and show them your passport and check any luggage.

TIPS TRAVELLING TO/FROM MEXICO

ARRIVING IN MEXICO

Finding your Driver – After you pick up your luggage, exit the airport. DO NOT stop at any of the people *inside* the airport. Just look straight ahead and keep walking.

DEPARTING MEXICO

STEP 1:

Go to the ticket counter and provide the Airline Counter Agent the following:

1. Passport
2. Check Luggage
3. Proceed to gate security.

STEP 2:

While on the plane returning to the U.S. you will need to complete a U.S. Border customs Declaration.

You will Hold onto the form after you complete it, once you deplane and go through customs, you will need to give this to the Customs Agent along with your Passport. If this is your final destination, pick up your baggage and depart the airport.



This applies to **CONNECTING FLIGHTS ONLY!** For example.... U.S. arrival from Cancun -> then Houston to Denver.....

You will clear customs at connecting city. Fill out the normal customs form that was handed out on the plane from Cancun. Go through customs. After you clear customs, go to baggage claim and pick up your bags. You will re-check your bags (depending on the airport) they may have a baggage re-check area nearby after you pick-up your luggage.

Once you recheck your bags, you will go through TSA checkpoint again and go to your departing gate. There could be a long distance between your gates because you're going from International to Domestic. Be sure to check monitors for your Departure Gate.

Pick up your bags at baggage claim and depart airport.
