MONTREAL CARIMAS FESTIVAL

Additionally, Carimas provides a space for people from all backgrounds to come together, learn from one another, and celebrate the shared heritage and contributions of the Caribbean diaspora to Montreal's multicultural fabric.

Montreal Carimas Festival is comprised of 4 different aspects that include:

- 1) **two pageants** for pre-teens, teenage girls and young adults,
- 2) a kiddie's/junior carnival (Petit Carimas),
- 3) the street parade (Carimas) and
- 4) **the cool down and show in the park** (Carimas Sizzle). All events will happen over a one-month period beginning with the pageant in June and ending with the Sizzle.
