Common Stalking Behaviors:

- Unwanted voice or text messages
- Unwanted emails or social media contact
- Unwanted gifts
- Being followed or seeing the stalker show up at places unexpectedly
- Surveillance, watching, or gathering information about you
- Threatening, intimidating, or blackmailing
- Interfering in your professional or social life
- Damaging or stealing personal property
- Harassing other people close to you

Alaska Law:

- Stalking is charged as a Class A misdemeanor - *knowingly engaging in a course of conduct that places another person in fear of danger AS 11.41.270*
