At the Friday evening campfire and social time the Veterans were all asked and answered "Why they joined the military?" On Saturday, September 11th, all gathered around the

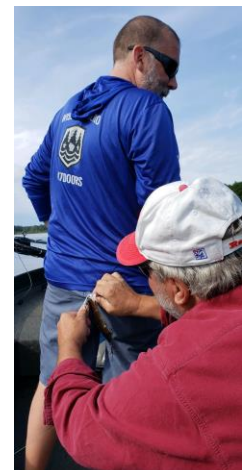
evening campfire and paused to remember those who were lost in the tragic events of this day 20 years ago and the war that followed. The veterans group included Vietnam veterans, Gulf War veterans, and three active duty sailors. One of the vets actually was scheduled to enlist on September 11th, 2001 but was delayed because of the terrorist attack and federal buildings being closed. The discussion was very impressive and emotional. The fishing was semi-productive. Four muskies were caught, only one of legal size (36") caught by Charlie LaPine. One 31 inch musky was boated by veteran Brad Kopish under the guidance of volunteer guide Charlie LaPine. There were a number of 33" northern and a few nice bass taken. The vets confirmed, everyone had a great time fishing.



On Sunday everyone met for a continental breakfast, fished for awhile, had lunch at noon back at the motel and awards were given. A neat story about Brad Kopish's musky. Brad had planned to attend the outing

with his father who also is a veteran. Unfortunately, his father passed away two weeks before. Brad was hesitant about attending but after some reassuring from Richard that the comradery of the other veterans attending may be a great support, Brad decided to join us. As it turns out, on Brad's last cast of the outing on Sunday, he hooked into his prize winning musky. Brad assured everyone, this one was for his dad who knew was attending in a very special way.

March 3rd Meeting Recap

The WinnebagoLand Musky Club held a regular meeting on March 3rd at the American Legion hall. This meeting was designated as a Planning/Ideas meeting. Only 10 members out of 50 attended. There was no speaker at this meeting. President Scott wanted to bring some ideas to the front to help restart and refresh the Club from the doldrums of the COVID pandemic. Treasurer Ron Lange reported in that we have over \$11,000 in checking and savings. This amount included \$1,680 that members prepaid for the 2020 formal banquet which has been postponed. Ron stated that we are in very good financial shape to go forward. He expressed concern for the future revenue side in that the 2021 Sportsman's Rummage Sale was cancelled along with the Alliance boat raffle. Our plan is to run the food concession at the next Rummage Sale.

We discussed the fact that the Alliance is not sponsoring the boat raffle for 2021 and how it affects our Club. The Alliance lost the relationship with Ranger as a sponsor. This relationship included the ability to obtain a Raffle Boat and a Tournament Boat. The tough thing is that the Raffle Boat was our Club's largest source of revenue. We are waiting to hear from the Alliance on this issue. Currently, with a lack of continuing revenue sources we do not have plans to fund any fish stocking projects at this time. President Scott and the officers are seeking suggestions from our members regarding fundraising efforts. Call or text Scott (920-948-2283) if you have an idea for a revenue producing idea. We decided to hold off on any stocking and other major projects temporarily until we have our future revenue sources lined up.

Vice President, Richard Feustel reviewed the results of the 5-question survey we sent to members in January. We were trying to discern from this questionnaire the comfort levels of members regarding the annual banquet. About half of responding members indicated that they were uncomfortable holding the postponed banquet in 2021. With that in mind, it was decided to hold off on our banquet until March of 2022. We have most of the prizes already purchased and being held in storage. Typically, we need about 80 participants to break even on a banquet. We want as many members and guests as possible to attend. Our banquets are not designed as fundraisers but rather as an opportunities to recognize the Club's achievements and have an affordable social fun event with members.

It was discussed and decided to have an Awards Presentation for the 2020 WinnebagoLand Musky Club Champions. This will be an awards night only, no banquet and will be at our regular Wednesday, August 4th meeting. We will formally recognize and award the 2020 plaques to the rightful winners, have some pizza, enjoy a couple member created desserts, and have a couple of small raffles. As stated earlier, the postponed formal banquet will be held in March of 2022 (details to follow).

January Meeting

The Winnebago Land Musky Club held a regular meeting on January 6th at the American Legion hall. The meeting was sparsely attended by 12 members. We were able to socially distance ourselves very well. There was no special speaker or program so if you did not attend, you did not miss out on a speaker.

We did go over some basic business of the Club. The treasurer, Ron Lange reported the Club has slightly over \$11,000 in our bank account at this time. We had around \$10,000 in revenues and \$1,000 in expenses in 2020. We earned \$8,225 in raffle boat ticket sales, a record year for the Club. We reviewed the results of our virtual election of officers for 2021 and will repeat those individuals' names for you. Incumbent President-Scott Klapperich, New Vice President-Richard Feustel, Incumbent Secretary-Beth Maeder, and Incumbent Treasurer-Ron Lange. We thank Jerry LaPine for his service as Vice President. He assured us he is still here to help the Club as always.

New Business

We did vote to add two extra award categories for our annual awards banquet. We added an award for Female National Award and Youth National Award categories.

At the meeting we had much discussion about a banquet for 2021. We do have the Legion Hall reserved for Saturday, March 27th with most of the banquet prizes (our largest expense) already purchased and in storage. As already stated, we had low attendance at this meeting and a number of issues were discussed regarding the banquet. Here are a few issues that were discussed. Nothing has been agreed to until we have more input from members. The banquet plans can be easily finalized and implemented as we have already acquired most everything. Here are some discussion points and we would be very happy to hear from you to give us your thoughts. We desire to have a banquet but only if the comfort level is there for all.
