THE LAST REGULAR MEETING - JUNE 5TH

Mat Hegy owner of Mat's Reel Repair in Eagle River made an excellent presentation to the club. Mat discussed a number of maintenance issues that need fishermen's regular attention. One of the maintenance issues that he advised was to NOT TO overlubricate your reel. It ends up collecting more debris that wears out parts. He also advised that reel owners pay careful attention to the drag, not just tighten it to the hilt and leave it there forever. One hint was to not leave your reel out in the weather constantly. Another, pay attention to the knob on the side of the reel that controls the free spooling and adjust it for each lure you are using. It is very sensitive and really makes backlash messes less frequent. The items mentioned are just a few of the things discussed and learned about at this meeting. Mat mentioned that maintaining reels regularly really helps keeps these intricate pieces serve you longer.
