## RULES:

1. Exhibitors must follow the general rules \& policies listed in the front of this Handbook.
2. All exhibits in this department must have been grown by the exhibitor.
3. Exhibits should be free from dirt, rot \& mechanical damage.
4. High quality, uniformity \& attractiveness are the key to a good exhibit. Choose entries that are typical of the variety, that are market ready, of the same ripeness, shape and size when more than one specimen is required.
5. Apples, lemons, pears (large fruit), should be uniform in color and have the stems and natural waxiness left on but no leaves or branches attached.
6. Berries, such as blackberries, huckleberries, raspberries etc. should have their stems removed. Strawberries should have their caps \& stems left on. Provided berry baskets will hold 1.5 cups and should be filled and slightly rounded.
7. Exhibitors entering in the Fair are urged to replace wilted \& faded items with fresh ones to keep Land Products Department freshlooking through last day of fair.
8. All classes listing "in water" or "1 basket" will have container provided by the Land Products Department.
