"For over 5 years, four siblings have lived within the foster care system. Among the siblings is Tony, the oldest at 17 who carries a quiet strength far beyond his years. He has always put his brothers and sisters before himself---especially Manny, who has been diagnosed with autism. When asked what he wanted for Christmas, Tony paused, his eyes filling with tears, and whispered," I don't think I ever think about that".

Tony is a high school senior and an honor student with dreams as bright as they are selfless.



After graduation, he plans to enroll in the fire academy to become a fire fighter. His goal is simple yet profound: to earn enough so that one day all his siblings can live together again----safe, loved and under one roof."


