Clothing and Bedding Donation - Andrea

This was the 3rd year since we began our donation event. We partnered with the Hsi Lai Temple/BLIA Long Beach Volunteers Chapter to collect donations of clothing, shoes, purses, coats, jackets, blankets, sheets, pillows and towels. Originally, we wanted to help the domestic violence shelter, Lydia's House. They had a fire in December 2023, and all of their supplies were lost. Since our first event, a huge success, the plan was to grow and help more people. This year's event was held on Saturday, December 13th in the parking lot of the Hsi Lai Temple Education Center at the corner of Colima and Hacienda. The goal was to involve the entire community to help those in need with clothing, hygiene products and bedding. Our partnership also included the Union Rescue Mission who provided two big trucks, pallets and huge cardboard bins for the donations. The bins were rolled out, filled, removed & truckloads were transported throughout the day in a round-robin manner. Business donations were received earlier in the week.

Theresa L. donated 1251 pairs of brand-new shoes in the boxes. Other businesses donated large amounts of various items as well. Ever grateful to all of our members who joined to volunteer their time and efforts, and to all of those from our organization and community that donated the much-needed items. It was a huge success. We continue to improve with our efforts. The 2nd year we collected 18 pallets and this year we doubled the amount to 36 pallets!

- Keep a reading list




