How to Change Your Name

Changing your name on the Marriage License (Lines 30A-31C) only changes your name legally. It **DOES NOT** change your name on DMV records, Social Security, Passport, Health Benefits, Insurance or other legal documents. These must be done individually and require a Certified Copy. Once you receive the certified copy(ies) from the county clerk's office you can then start the

For Social Security and DMV name changes:

You must **first** go to <u>Social Security **(SSA)**</u> and **then** to the **DMV** and other agencies. See below for further instructions.

To change your name at SSA:

- You must print and fill out an Application for a Social Security Card. The application may be found at: https://www.ssa.gov/forms/ss-5.pdf
- Take your application and documents to your local Social Security office.
- You must show the required documents:
- Original Recorded Marriage Certificate (Certified Copy)
- · Current form of ID: a U.S. State ID. U.S. Driver's License, OR U.S. Passport.
- Please also note: If you have not already established U.S. citizenship with SSA, you
 will need to show proof of this; SSA will accept the following as proof of
 citizenship: original U.S. birth certificate OR U.S. passport.
- To change your name on your driver's license or ID you will need to visit your local <u>DMV</u> office and:
 - · Complete a Driver License or ID card Application (Form DL 44).
 - Get the form in person at the DMV or have it mailed to you by calling (800) 777-0133.
 - Provide your original Recorded Marriage Certificate (Certified Copy) as your proof of name change.
 - · Surrender your old CA driver's license or ID.
 - You will also need to pay a fee of \$27 or \$29.
- o To change your name on other agency records:
 - Contact those agencies directly to see what their name change requirements are. Don't wait too long, as many agencies have a 10-30 day window.
