

Welcome to Alcoholics Together...

We welcome all who are new to our meetings. If you are newly sober, just moved to town, looking for a new homegroup, returning from a slip, or a returning to homegroup member who has not been active. We welcome you and we are here to help.

Alcoholics Together is a special place for LGBTQ, and all are welcome at our open meetings. To participate you must have a desire to stop drinking or identify as an alcoholic or have a drinking problem. There are other 12 step fellowships that may help you as well, we will be happy to make some suggestions.

If you have a drinking problem and/or are newly sober, we are here to help you achieve lasting sobriety and to find out if you are Alcoholic according to the first 164 pages of the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous. Our main purpose is to carry the message of the 12 steps and pass it on.

We believe in the homegroup concept and sponsorship. We suggest you get a sponsor as soon as possible. This will be someone who has taken all 12 steps, who is actively sponsored and usually active in our homegroup.

We have a variety of meetings available throughout the week, 7 days a week. Please join us every Saturday at 12:15pm for our Newcomers meeting and Saturday night at 8pm for our speaker meeting which is normally followed by fellowship (the meeting after the meeting), and throughout the week for book studies and discussion meetings to learn about the first three steps and more.

We suggest you get a Big Book right away and read the first 164 pages, attend meetings, ask for an available sponsor who will help you. We ask if you are new, seat and listen and if you do not have experience with the topic or step, we ask that you work with the homegroup member before sharing. Newcomer and Speaker Meetings are a great place to start.

You can also take the online survey or AA pamphlet, "12 Questions Is AA For Me?"

We hope you find what we have, lasting sobriety, a new way of life and a power that will solve your problems.

Alcoholics Together has been a longtime Las Vegas Homegroup since 1986. Originally started by two courageous women, Marty, and Colleen in their home in 1984. Alcoholics Together (AT) was very controversial and had difficulty getting listed as (G) in the directory with Central Office but was listed by 1986. We have helped thousands to recover for over 35 years! Today it may not seem like a big deal (Orientation) or the need for a LGBTQ group such as AT, but AT is a link to the past and to pride when at a time LGBTQ people were being killed by Bashings and Aids. AT was born of need and remains of need. Today there is more acceptance, but just as there is a need for LGBTQ Centers throughout the world to promote pride, self-esteem, self-confidence, friendship, and mutual understanding, and so AT is just such a place to offer all of this and more.

Thank you to all who have served in the past, for our founders and those carrying the torch and passing it on today.

Please use the phone list enclosed, remember we are Anonymous and never break our anonymity at the level of press, radio, film and social media. But we are not Anonymous amongst ourselves, and we are here to help each other recover from a seemingly hopeless state of mind and body, through work and self-sacrifice for others.






Welcome Newcomer to AA!


If you are serious about getting and staying sober, do these things first.



What's your score?

Did you answer "Yes" four or more times? If so, you are probably in trouble with alcohol. Why do we say this? Because thousands of people in A.A. have said so for many years. They found out the truth about themselves — the hard way.

But again, only *you* can decide whether you think A.A. is for you. Try to keep an open mind on the subject. If the answer is "Yes," we will be glad to show you how we stopped drinking ourselves. Just call.

A.A. does not promise to solve your life's problems. But we can show you how we are learning to live without drinking "one day at a time." We stay away from that "first drink." If there is no first one, there cannot be a tenth one. And when we got rid of alcohol, we found that life became much more manageable.

Is A.A. for You?

Only you can decide whether you want to give A.A. a try — whether you think it can help. The questions that follow below may help you make a decision.

We who are in A.A. came because we finally gave up trying to control our drinking. We still hated to admit that we could never drink safely. Then we heard from other A.A. members that we had an illness. (Some of us thought so for years!) We found out that many people suffered from the same feelings of guilt and loneliness and hopelessness that we did. We found out that we had these feelings because we had the disease of alcoholism.

We decided to try to face up to what alcohol had done to us. Here are some of the questions we tried to answer *honestly*. If we answered "Yes" to four or more questions, we were in deep trouble with our drinking. See how you do. Remember, there is no disgrace in facing up to the fact that you have a problem.

1	Have you ever decided to stop drinking for a week or so, but only lasted for a couple of days? Most of us in A.A. made all kinds of promises to ourselves and to our families. We could not keep them. Then we came to A.A. and A.A. said: "Just try not to drink today." (If you do not drink today, you cannot get drunk today.)		
2	Do you wish people would mind their own business about your drinking — stop telling you what to do? In A.A. we do not tell anyone to do anything. We just talk about our own drinking, the trouble we got into, and how we stopped. We will be glad to help you, if you want us to.		
3	Have you ever switched from one kind of drink to another in the hope that this would keep you from getting drunk? We tried all kinds of ways. We made our drinks weak. Or just drank beer. Or we did not drink cocktails. Or only drank on weekends. You name it, we tried it. But if we drank anything with alcohol in it, we usually got drunk eventually.		
4	Have you had to have a drink upon awakening during the past year? Do you need a drink to get started, or to stop shaking? This is a pretty sure sign that you are not drinking "socially."		
5	Do you envy people who can drink without getting into trouble? At one time or another, most of us have wondered why we were not like most people, who really can take it or leave it.		
6	Have you had problems connected with drinking during the past year? Be honest! Doctors say that if you have a problem with alcohol and keep on drinking, it will get worse — never better. Eventually, you will die, or end up in an institution for the rest of your life. The only hope is to stop drinking.

7	Has your drinking caused trouble at home? Before we came into A. A., most of us said		
	that it was the people or problems at home that made us drink. We could not see that our drinking just made everything worse. It never solved problems anywhere or anytime.		
8	Do you ever try to get "extra" drinks at a party because you do not get enough?		
	Most of us used to have a "few" before we started out if we thought it was going to be that kind of party. And if drinks were not served fast enough, we would go someplace else to get more.		
9	Do you tell yourself you can stop drinking any time you want to, even though you keep getting drunk when you don't mean to?		
	Many of us kidded ourselves into thinking that we drank because we wanted to. After we came into A.A., we found out that once we started to drink, we couldn't stop.		
10	Have you missed days of work or school because of drinking?		
	Many of us admit now that we "called in sick" lots of times when the truth was that we were hungover or on a drunk.		
11	Do you have "blackouts"? A "blackout" occurs when we cannot remember what happened for hours or days while we were drinking. When we came to A.A., we found out that this is a pretty sure sign of alcoholic drinking.		
12	Have you ever felt that your life would be better if you did not drink?		
	Many of us started to drink because drinking made life seem better, at least for a while. By the time we got into A.A., we felt trapped. We were drinking to live and living to drink. We were sick and tired of being sick and tired.
