Limited Entry Rules

The process of accepting entries for our trials will be:

Entries Process

All trials for the month will open on the 1st of the prior month. For example, May trials will open April 1st, June trials will open May 1st and so on. This season all entries will be accepted and processed online through Agility Rocks. You can access the entry on opening day at https://agilityrocks.com/. Once the maximum number of runs is reached the trial will be full. You can email the trial secretary to be put on waiting list. If you need to enter multiple dogs, DO NOT HIT THE SUBMIT BUTTON until BOTH dogs have been entered – once your entry is submitted, it cannot be added to or edited. If you do not already have an account with Agility Rocks, it is highly recommended that you take the time to set one up prior to the trial open date. Class Changes

A dog that has entered a trial and subsequently earns a title shall be permitted to move up in that class, as long as the trial secretary is notified at least **one week** prior to the date of the trial. If you do not contact the trial secretary, you may not be permitted to move up on the day of the trial. Please check your confirmations to ensure you are entered in the proper class.

Directions to the Berryman Ranch (70, 50050 Range Road 233, Leduc County)

Directions from Calgary Trail/Hwy 2 – Go south on Highway 2 and take exit 522 towards Edmonton Int'l Airport/Nisku/Business Pk/10 Ave. Keep left and follow signs for Nisku/Leduc/Business Park 10th Ave/N Industrial Sector. Turn Left onto Airport Road. Stay on Airport Road (will turn into Township Road 502) until Range Road 233. Turn right onto Range Road 233. Turn right into Southview Ridge subdivision and trial site will be third driveway on the left. Driveway will be marked with cones.

Directions from South Anthony Henday to Highway 14 – Head south on Anthony Henday and take the exit for Highway 14 East. Turn right onto Range Road 232 and follow 8.9 km to T-intersection, Township Road 510. Turn left onto Township Road 510 and then take first right onto Range Road 233. Drive approximately 8 km and turn right into Southview Ridge subdivision and trial site will be third driveway on the left. Driveway will be marked with cones.

Directions from Highway 21 – Head south on Highway 21 and turn right onto Highway 625 west. Drive for 5 km and turn left onto Range Road 233. Turn right into Southview Ridge subdivision and trial site will be third driveway on the left. Driveway will be marked with cones.

Agility Class Descriptions

Regular Classes: These classes are open to all dogs, 18 months of age or older, as described within the current AAC rules. **Special Classes:** These classes are open to all dogs but are intended for dogs that are of a size or stature that limits there jumping ability. A dog may no longer compete in Regular classes after being entered at an official trial in any Special class except that they may move to Veterans.

Veterans Classes: These classes are for dogs seven years of age or older that are currently competing in any Standard Agility Class and for dogs five years of age or older who have competed in the Specials Agility Class for a minimum of one calendar year.

Junior Handlers: We are pleased to offer junior handlers classes. The AAC has expanded the Junior Handlers program to allow juniors to run in and earn qualifying scores in all classes, including games. Juniors will have veteran times and may run at a height lower than that at which the dog normally competes and can accumulate their qualifying scores with different dogs.

Starters Games Classes: The Starters Games Classes are for dogs that have not completed two clear rounds in that particular game under two different judges.

Advanced Games Classes: The Advanced Games Classes are for dogs that have not completed three clear rounds in that particular game under two different judges.

Masters Games Classes: The Masters Games Classes are for dogs that have fulfilled the requirement of achieving three clear rounds in each particular game under two different judges.

Starter Standard Class: The Starters Class is for dogs not having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title. Dogs completing three (3) clear rounds of Starters Standard, as defined by the AAC Rules and Regulations, shall be awarded the ADC title.

Advanced Standard Class: The Advanced Class is for dogs not having earned the Advanced Agility Dog of Canada (AADC) title. Dogs completing three (3) clear rounds of Advanced Standard, as defined by the AAC Rules and Regulations, shall be awarded the AADC title.

Masters Standard Class: The Masters Class is for dogs not having earned the Masters Agility Dog of Canada (MADC) title. Dogs completing three (3) clear rounds of Masters Standard, as defined by the AAC Rules and Regulations, shall be awarded the MADC title.

Steeplechase: The Steeplechase class demonstrates the dog's ability to run and jump at speeds while maintaining control on the A-frame and weave poles and is open to all dogs eligible to compete in AAC events at any level.

Challenge: This class is only open to dogs competing in Masters Standard class and tests both handling skills and speed.

Team Relay: This class is open to all dogs eligible to compete in other AAC qualifying events at the Starters, Advanced or Masters levels. This game demonstrates team spirit, strategy and sportsmanship.

Biathlon Classes: The International Biathlon classes are "All Level", open to all dogs eligible to compete in other AAC qualifying events at any performance level, and in any category. No pre-requisite is required. FEO runs are allowed.

Notice to Exhibitors

Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of the rules and regulations of the AAC, including but not limited to the following:

- This event is held under AAC Rules and Regulations and is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age, pure breed or mixed breed, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance.
- > Obstacles shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of the rules and regulations of the AAC and shall conform to AAC specification.
- No leads, food or any other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.
- ➤ It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may be asked to leave the trial site and NO REFUND of fees shall be given.
- All dogs must be penned, crated or attended on leash when not in the ring. All dogs must be under control when exiting the ring. Any dog engaging in aggressive or out of control behavior upon exit of the ring may be disqualified and / or required to leave the trial site and NO REFUND of fees shall be given.
- Exhibitors MUST keep crate and exercise areas clean. Please clean up after yourselves and your dogs.

 Anyone who does not clean up after themselves or their dogs may be required to leave the trial site and NO REFUND will be given.
- > Refunds, cancellations, or changes after the closing date, will be subject to a \$10 administration fee (except injured dogs with a certificate from a veterinarian) providing the trial secretary is informed prior to the trial date.
- ➤ ALL DOGS MUST HAVE AN AAC ID CARD AND NUMBER TO COMPETE IN AN AAC TRIAL. If your dog does not yet have an AAC ID card, please register with AAC at www.aac.ca.
- The trial site is outdoors on a grass surface in a fully fenced ring.
- > COMPETITION ONLY: Bitches in season (BIS) will be allowed to enter Mut Hut events. Please see the requirements to run a BIS.

The Trial Committee has the right to refuse any entry for causes which they deem sufficient. Please check your entry before sending to ensure all required information has been completed, including dog's ID number, class and correct jump height. Incomplete entries will not be accepted. The "General Agreement form" must be signed and included with your entry to comply with AAC's acceptance to this trial.

Requirements for Bitches in Season (BIS) at Mut Hut Trials:

In order to run a BIS at our trial the following conditions must be met:

- 1. Handlers are required to notify the trial secretary that they will be running a BIS at the event as soon as it is known.
- 2. If choosing to run a BIS, handlers are required to minimize the exposure of their BIS to other dogs. This means crating away from other dogs. There will be a designated parking area, and we require that the dog is benched out of the vehicle.
- 3. Handlers of a BIS must minimize their movement around trial grounds and potty the BIS in a designated area.
- 4. Competitors will be notified if a BIS is on site.
- 5. A protective mat shall be used at the start line. The mat must be supplied by the competitor.
- 6. BIS are required to always wear protective panties when on the trial grounds except when in the designated relief area.
- 7. BIS will run at the end of the class.
- 8. Non-competing BIS ARE NOT permitted on site.
