

Earthquake Kit



All children must have an earthquake kit on site on their first day of Daycare. No child may be left at Mis Amigos Day Care without an earthquake kit, a signed contract, and all other paperwork completed.

At the end of the school year, take your earthquake kit home and change out the snacks and drinks. They expire.

1. Buy a Ziploc Big Bag.

- a. If there is a significant seismic event that requires evacuation of the school, the staff will be grabbing all of the earthquake kits and dumping cubby contents into larger bags. This enables the staff to bring more with them, so a larger, less full bag is both fine and potentially helpful.
- b. Sizes:
 - i. 5 gallon
 - ii. XL [10 gallon](#)
 - iii. Jumbo [20 gallon](#)

2. Label the bag clearly using a Sharpie.

- a. Write your child's full name and your cell phone number on the outside of the bag.
- 3. **Print a photo of your happy family.**
 - a. On the back of the photo write the following:
 - i. Your child's full name and date of birth and any known allergies
 - ii. Your home address. If your child lives in two houses, be sure to include both parents.
 - iii. Parents' names and cell phone numbers and places of employment
 - iv. An out-of-state contact number for a family member willing to come to SF to pick up your child in case your child was orphaned in a seismic or cataclysmic event.
 - v. 3 to 5 other phone contact numbers of family members you want us to notify.
 - b. Put the photo in the bag so the photo can be seen through the bag.
- 4. **In the bag:**
 - a. Enough **boxed drinks** (juice, milk, etc.) for three days. We have plenty of water stored.
 - b. **Snacks** for three days, pack things your child LOVES.
 - c. Whatever your child needs for **overnight**: Pull-ups? Binky? Particular stuffed friend?
